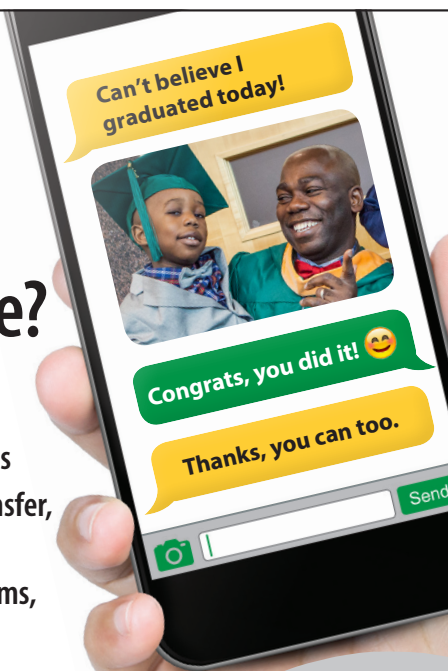

Spinach PUFFS

4 TO 6 SERVINGS

ingredients

- 1 10-oz package frozen chopped spinach, thawed
- 1/2 cup crumbled feta
- 1/4 cup minced onion
- 1 tbsp olive oil
- 1 tsp chopped dill
- 1 tsp minced garlic
- Kosher salt and freshly ground black pepper
- 2 large eggs
- 1 sheet frozen puff pastry (from a 17.3-ounce package), thawed, rolled out to a 12-inch square, kept chilled

A standard 6-cup muffin pan

preparation

Using your hands, squeeze spinach until dry, forcing out as much water as possible (too much water will make for a soggy filling; you should have about 2/3 cup well-drained spinach). Mix spinach and next 5 ingredients in a medium bowl. Season to taste with salt and pepper. In a small bowl, beat 1 egg to blend; fold into spinach mixture.

Cut puff pastry into 3 equal strips. Reserve 1 strip for another use. Cut each remaining strip into 3 squares for a total of 6. Place a square in each muffin cup, pressing into bottom and up sides and leaving corners pointing up. Divide filling among cups. Fold pastry over filling, pressing corners together to meet in center. **DO AHEAD** Spinach puffs can be assembled 3 hours ahead. Cover puffs and chill.

Preheat oven to 400°. Beat remaining egg to blend in a small bowl. Brush pastry with egg wash (this will give the pastry a nice sheen). Bake until pastry is golden brown and puffed, about 25 minutes. Transfer to a wire rack; let puffs cool in pan for 10 minutes. Run a sharp paring knife around pan edges to loosen; turn out puffs onto rack to cool slightly before serving.



there's something about mary!

The **Bloody Mary** has been the morning cocktail of choice for decades, but the origin of how that came to be is nearly impossible to get to the bottom of—unlike the drink itself.

Several sources point to Harry's New York Bar in Paris, where bartender Fernand "Pete" Petiot supposedly started mixing vodka brought over by Russian émigrés with canned tomato juice in the 1920s. This version is light and refreshing, with a savory underbelly from fish sauce, a touch of sweetness from soju, a kick from a mixture of kimchi and powdered wasabi, and a salty-spicy punch from the rim of togarashi, a Japanese spice blend. Almost anything goes. "We've all seen cheeseburgers [atop Bloody Marys]. If we've gone that far, certainly anything you find in your fridge is acceptable." A sentiment that for the first day of the New Year feels just right.

For the Bloody Mary

4 cups tomato juice • 2½ cups soju • ½ cup, [fish sauce](#) plus 1 tbsp, [kimchi brine](#) • ½ cup lemon juice • 1 tbsp soy sauce • 1 tbsp • ½ tsp [Tabasco](#) • ½ tsp prepared horseradish • ¼ tsp celery salt • ¼ tsp wasabi powder • ice

For the Garnish:

Castelvetro olives • Pickled cocktail onions • Pickled ramps • Cucumber kimchi • Cabbage kimchi • Lime wedges • Togarashi salt

Making it

In a large pitcher, stir together all of the Bloody Mary ingredients until well chilled, then divide between ice-filled glasses. Garnish each glass with a skewer containing [an olive](#), pickled onion, pickled ramp and cucumber kimchi. Float a pinch of cabbage kimchi and a lime wedge next to the skewer, garnish with togarashi salt then serve.

& REGULATIONS

The appearance before our **Historical Area Commission** can be traumatic for many residents new and seasoned as well. We are not alone.

Residents of Woodstock Vermont, a picturesque town, which has provided a backdrop for early environmentalists, the Rockefeller's and even the Budweiser Clydesdales, is fighting a battle over how to keep the charm that has become its trademark. At issue: window shutters.

As reported by the AP, their zoning regulations require that most buildings in the central district have shutters, relics that once helped protect buildings but have evolved into a symbol of the architectural beauty of rural New England.

Many shutters adorning homes and buildings were installed decades ago, and they are deteriorating. Some property owners are questioning the community's requirement, arguing that the regulations are enforced irregularly, and that some buildings look better without shutters.

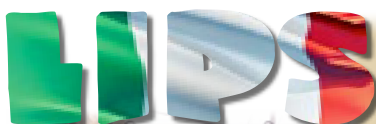

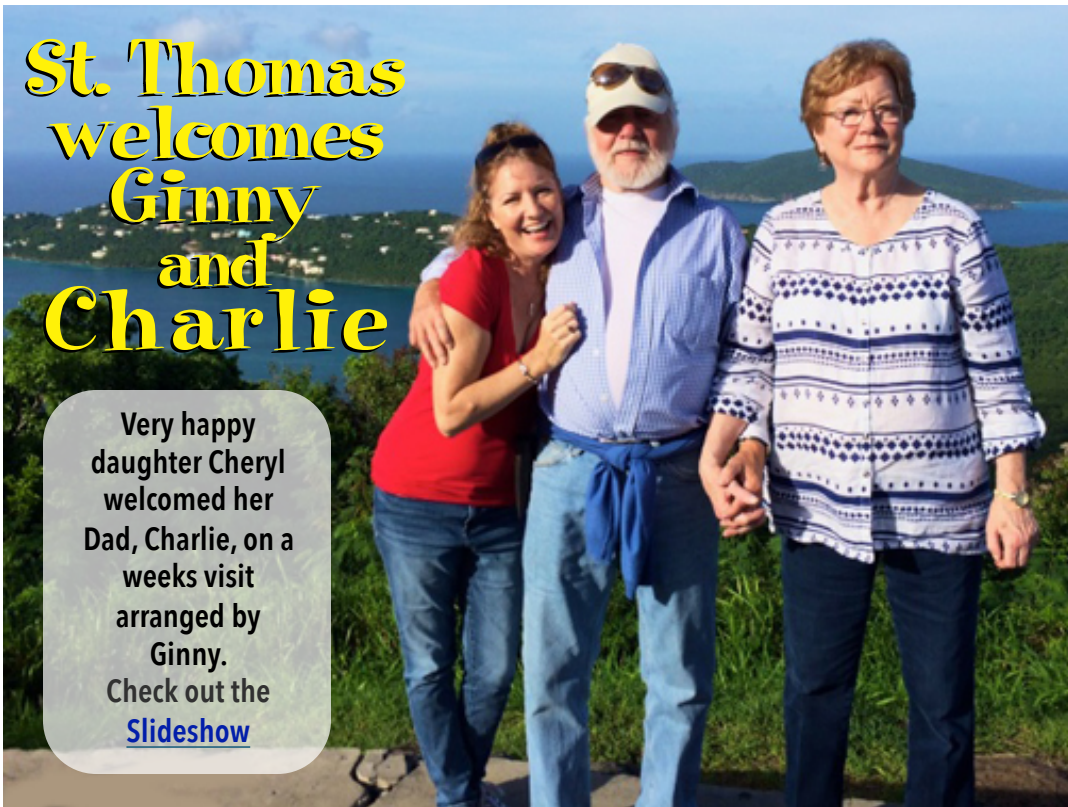
The **Burning of the Greens** is an ancient tradition signifying the light of Christ illuminating the deep darkness.

In 2014, the village lost a legal battle with someone who wanted to remove their shutters, so officials rewrote the rules. The bigger issue is about more than just shutters, said Town Planner Michael Brands. It's about anything that changes the look of a house in Woodstock's design review district — including picket fences, window air conditioners, kitchen vents and, more recently heat pumps. New technology has to be made to blend in to the architecture, and all is subject to review, he said.

"It's the look of the community that's very important to us," Brands said.

Deteriorating shutters can cost \$100 or more to replace, and it can be expensive even for some of Woodstock's well-to-do, Brands acknowledged.

"People are refusing to put them up now," he said.

Jennifer Henaghan, deputy research director at the Chicago-based American Planning Association, said such conflicts are common across the country.

"No one likes to be told what to do," she said. "It's up to the communities to ensure that their requirements are in line with what the community wants."
