- **4** *Dr. William Grant* performed the first successful appendectomy. On the table was was *Mary Gartside*. 1885, *Utah* became the 45th US state. 1896, The Negro National League, is organized by *Rube Foster*. 1920. Japanese forces begin the evacuation of *Guadalcanal*. 1942, *Sputnik I*, the Soviet satellite, fell to the earth from after its 15 month orbit.

Crank up oven to 375° Line a cookie sheet with

liqueur.

► Piehole Recipes

foil and place a cooling rack on top of the pan. This will allow the bacon to crisp on all sides.

Cut each bacon strip into 4 pieces. Cut the bacon in half and then cut each half in half again.

Wrap each thawed tater tot in bacon and then roll it in the brown sugar mixture. Place on top of the cookie rack.

Bake about 10 to 15 minutes at 375°, then agose the oven up to 400° and let them cook another 5 minutes. Check to see if they are crisping up. You may need to leave them in a tad longer. Check frequently at this point so they don't burn. Serve warm.


In order to quell any rumors, a fixture along Rt. 9, Radio Rick is alive but in the hospital. We wish him a speedy recovery.

SrA Elizabeth Loncki

Oct. 14, 1983 - Jan. 7, 2007 Eight years ago 23 year old Air Force senior Airman Elizabeth A. Loncki of New Castle became the first female Delaware soldier killed in Iraq. From the memorial at Hill Air Force Base, "Tim, Liz, and Dan were among an elite group of nearly 1,200 active duty EOD Airmen that the rest of the world looks too," said

Lt. Col. Craig Biondo, 775th Civil Engineer Squadron commander. "Simply put, they were the best in the world.'

"These Airmen were killed-in-action serving for freedom's cause in our nation's war against terrorism," said Maj. Gen. Kevin Sullivan, Ogden Air Logistics Center commander, shortly after the ceremony. "Their commitment to the unit's mission and the Air Force is unparalleled."



Columbus Day Celebration

The earliest known event carried out by the Italian Community was the celebration of Columbus Day. It was organized by Giovanni Lalli. It was celebrated on October 12 in the evening, after everyone had returned from work. This event took place from 1913 to 1918.

The Pestatore Band from Philadelphia supplied the music. The men would assemble in the West End and march through the streets and moved down Delaware Street to the wharf. Fireworks would be lined up along the wharf and the general population be treated to a splendid fireworks display.

Mr. Lalli would lead the parade riding a white stallion. His children would carry a picture of Christopher Columbus and the men would follow.

St. Gabriel's Lodge, O.S.I.A.
St. Anthony's Club was a local club and served the

community well. It did not wish to be part of a National Organization. As a result those members wished to have national ties, founded the Lodge in 1953 and affiliated itself with the Order Sons of Italy

This organization was not a rival to St. Anthony's Club, in fact both organizations worked side by side on many local projects. Luigi Indellini was the founder of the Lodge and served as its leader for many years.

The Business Community

A number of immigrants became successful businessmen in the community.

Giovanni Gambacorta, founded Gambacorta Motors in 1939. He began by selling used cars while employed at the Old Delaware Rayon plant. He was able to obtain a Willys franchise and began selling cars full time. The early years were a struggle but victory is not gained without a struggle. In 1946 a Kaiser franchise was obtained and Mr. Gambacorta sold Kaiser-Frazers, the Henry J as well as Willys Jeeps. When Kaiser withdrew from the automobile business a Chrysler franchise was secured. His children, Vincent, Henry and Anthony took over the operation of the business and it was the largest Chrysler-Plymouth dealership in the Delaware Valley.


