



thick, you need to season liberally; when he demonstrated for us, the surface of the meat was virtually white from salt.

ingredients

- 1 2"-thick Porterhouse steak, trimmed (about 2 lb.)
- 1 tablespoon vegetable oil
- Kosher salt and freshly ground black pepper
- 3 tablespoons unsalted butter, room temperature

n r e n a r a t i o n

Let steak sit at room temperature 30 minutes before cooking, which will help it cook quickly and more evenly. Heat broiler. Heat a large skillet, preferably cast iron, over medium-high heat, then heat oil in pan until smoking. Season steak very generously with salt and pepper and cook until a deep brown crust forms on underside (do not turn), about 4 minutes. Transfer steak to a cutting board, turning it browned side up.

Cut meat from bone in 2 pieces (strip steak and filet mignon). Slice both pieces straight down perpendicular to the bone 1" thick. Replace sliced steak around the bone (it should look like a whole sliced steak) and return to skillet, browned side up. Top with butter and broil until butter is melted and steak is medium-rare, 4-6 minutes. Serve steak with buttery pan juices spooned over.







SrA Elizabeth Loncki

Oct. 14, 1983 - Jan. 7, 2007

Ten years ago 23 year old Air Force senior Airman Elizabeth A. Loncki of New Castle became the first female Delaware soldier killed in Iraq. From the memorial at Hill Air Force Base, "Tim, Liz, and Dan were among an elite group of nearly 1,200 active duty EOD Airmen that the rest of the world looks too," said Lt. Col. Craig Biondo, 775th Civil Engineer Squadron commander. "Simply put, they were the best in the world."

"These Airmen were killed-in-action serving for freedom's cause in our nation's war against terrorism," said Maj. Gen. Kevin Sullivan, Ogden Air Logistics Center commander, shortly after the ceremony. "Their commitment to the unit's mission and the Air Force is unparalleled."


