Charles Parks and William Penn

Renown sculptor Charles Parks' iconic 9-foot-1 William Penn statue graces Dewey Park and celebrates Penn's 1682 landing in what is now New Castle, thanks to Mayor Jack Klingmeyer's vision, and the collaborative efforts of many. When Klingmeyer sought to do something spectacular for the city and its history, he formed a committee and engaged Mr. and Mrs. Lynmar Brock (Arsenal restaurateurs), George Freeberry (City Treasurer), Mikki DiEmidio (the Mayor's Secretary) and Mrs. Grace Duling Hayford (resident and school teacher) to assist with the mission and conduct the fundraising. Parks offered his Wilmington studio on the Brandywine River as the setting for numerous wine and cheese fundraisers. They were enormously successful and the full amount of funding needed to commission the Penn statue for New Castle was raised. It stands today where it was unveiled in 1984, as an attraction of note and a significant marker of city history.

DELAWARE STREET PROJECT UPDATE

Beginning on January 20th (Weather Permitting) the contractor for the City - Cirillo Brothers - will start the first phase of construction work at the wharf.

The City will close Delaware Street from The Strand to the wharf during this phase of construction. The



sidewalks will remain open for pedestrian use.

Cars will be detoured on Delaware Street from Second Street to Harmony to The Strand, with Delaware

Street being one way from The Strand to Second Street.

This phase of construction is estimated to be approximately 6 weeks in duration.

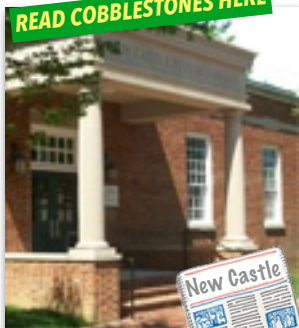

SWEET BACON Tater Tots



GET@MARKET

- 50 - 55 tater tots @ room temperature
- 1-16-oz package **Bacon** (strips cut in 4 pieces)
- 2/3 cup **Brown Sugar**
- 2 tablespoons **Chili Powder**

HERE'S HOW

Crank up oven to 375°
Line a cookie sheet with foil and place a cooling rack on top of the pan. This will allow the bacon to crisp on all sides.
Cut each bacon strip into 4 pieces. Cut the bacon in half and then cut each half in half again.
Wrap each thawed tater tot in bacon and then roll it in the brown sugar mixture. Place on top of the cookie rack.
Bake about 10 to 15 minutes at 375°, then goose the oven up to 400° and let them cook another 5 minutes. Check to see if they are crisping up. You may need to leave them in a tad longer. Check frequently at this point so they don't burn. Serve warm.



- 2 oz gin 3/4 oz simple syrup 3/4 oz fresh lime juice
- Champagne sprigs of mint

Fill a cocktail shaker with ice. Add the gin, simple syrup and lime juice. Shake until chilled, then strain into a flute. Top with Champagne and garnish with the sprig of mint.

Parks incorporated the symbolic gifts bestowed to Penn during the historic “Livery of Seisin” ceremony in the statute. Penn holds a key, a piece of turf, a twig and a porringer of river water, physical conveyances that represented a transfer of land, holdings and authority, in a ceremony that was practiced where English common law was followed.

The weathering of the statute over thirty-plus years dismayed resident Jim Travers in 2013, prompting him to spearhead efforts to restore its condition. Travers consulted with many, including the sculptor's widow, Inge Parks, before locating conservators Douglas Martenson of Philadelphia PA, and Linda Lennon of Newark DE, to steer the project. With support from New Castle City Council and the approval of the Historic Area Commission, Penn was power washed. Old wax was removed and a new blend of waxes was applied. Sandblasting had been proposed but ruled out by the professionals, noting it would risk losing details.

Thanks to the efforts of a concerned citizen, the fine details of the statue were again elevated to their finest condition, and with annual clean and wax applications, it can be expected to impress for many future generations.
