At Tuesday night's City Council meeting, Council passed an Ordinance [513] to amend Section 230-37 of the City Code to add a new subsection L prohibiting certain signage and other obstructions in public rights-of-way. Nuisance signs posted/ attached or painted on a structure or on anything else will be subject to potential fines of up to \$500.00. Several exceptions from the ordinance are provided for temporary educational, charitable, civic, religious, non-advertising directional signs, and signs advertising yard sales, open houses or houses for sale

## eggs Benedict



- 3 egg yolks
- Juice of 2 whole lemons
- 2 sticks butter, melted and slightly cooled
- Dash of salt



- Cayenne pepper
- 4 whole eggs
- 2 English muffins, split, toasted and buttered
- 4 slices Canadian bacon, warmed in a skillet
- Dash of paprika

## let's make breakfast

Add the egg yolks to a blender or a food processor. Add in the lemon juice and blend for several seconds. With the blender on, slowly drizzle in the melted butter. Turn off the blender and add in a little salt and cayenne. Whip it again until combined. Set this aside for a minute. Next, poach an egg by gently cracking an egg into simmering, slightly bubbling water. Leave the egg alone for 2 to 2 1/2 minutes, and then remove it with a slotted spoon and carefully place it on a plate. Repeat with the remaining eggs. To serve, place a buttered, toasted English muffin half on a plate. Top the English muffin with a warm slice of Canadian bacon. Place the warm poached egg on top. And then drizzle on some warm hollandaise.

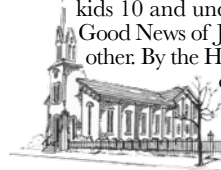

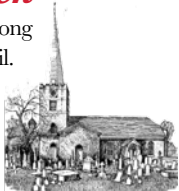

Patrol made a **DUI arrest** where the subject passed out while stopped in the roadway. A loaded firearm was found on the front seat.

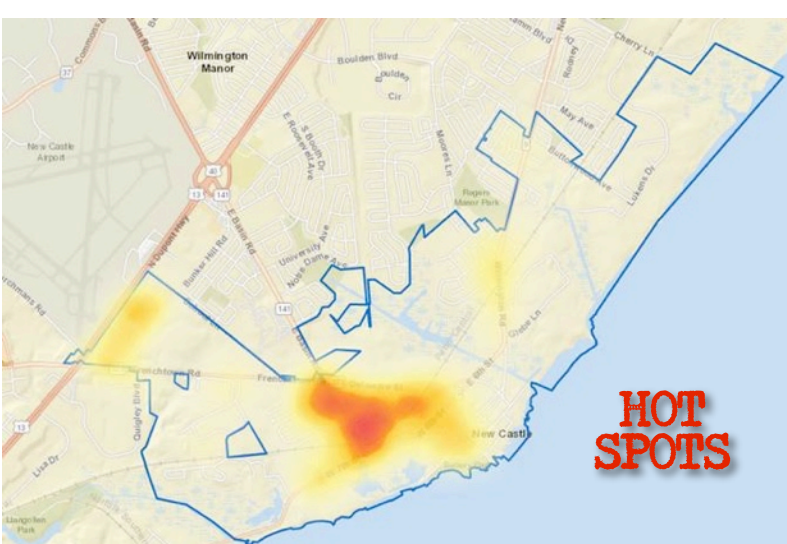
