At Tuesday night's City Council meeting, Council passed an Ordinance [513] to amend Section 230-37 of the City Code to add a new subsection L prohibiting certain signage and other obstructions in public rights-ofway. Nuisance signs posted/ attached or painted on a structure or on anything else will be subject to potential fines of up to \$500.00. Several exceptions from the ordinance are provided for temporary educational, charitable, civic, religious, nonadvertising directional signs, and signs advertising yard sales, open houses or houses for sale

This is the first of a series of environmental issues presentations held at the public library.



Add the egg yolks to a blender or a food processor. Add in the lemon juice and blend for several seconds. With the blender on, slowly drizzle in the melted butter. Turn off the blender and add in a little salt and cayenne. Whip it again until combined. Set this aside for a minute. Next, poach an egg by gently cracking an egg into simmering, slightly bubbling water. Leave the egg alone for 2 to 2 1/2 minutes, and then remove it with a slotted spoon and carefully place it on a plate. Repeat with the remaining eggs. To serve, place a buttered, toasted English muffin half on a plate. Top the English muffin with a warm slice of Canadian bacon. Place the warm poached egg on top. And then drizzle on some warm hollandaise.

We mixed the bourbon, shrub and bitters in a shaker. Strain into a

cold mule c. or old fashioned glass filled with ice. Top with Ginger beer to taste. Garnish with apple slices and fennel if desired.

The thief seemed to be targeting the priciest stuff, including about 25 squares of Ghirardelli chocolate, she said.





Patrol made a **DUI arrest** where the subject passed out while stopped in the roadway. A loaded firearm was found on the front seat.



Detectives made an arrest of a man who is responsible for a **South Street burglary.** Detectives continue to investigate several other pending thefts and burglaries in the South Street area.
