## CITY COUNCIL tidings



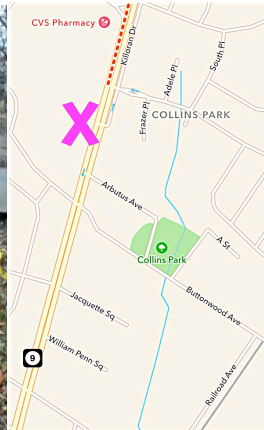
Buttonwood resident Paula Stockton brought a number of issues before City Council last Tuesday. After the Delaware Street "Green Street" presentation by Dave Athey, she mentioned many of the street and drainage issues that continue in their section of the City. A major hazard was the collapsed sidewalk just past Arbutus Ave. on New Castle Ave.

Cobblestones got a swift reply from Sen. Nicole Poore whose staff is contacting DelDOT. City Administrator Bill Barthel has already contacted

Rep. JJ Johnson and Sen. Michael Mulrooney. While it's not a City issue it does affect area residents and those who travel there daily.

In other Council business, Barbara Winkler and Rick Pennell, were re-appointed to the Board of Elections. Approved Historic Area Commission Re-Appointment: Jean Norvell, Mayor Appointments of Laura Fontana and Marty Wright with terms ending January 10, 2020.

Victor Bryson voiced his opposition to the possibility of a "Bark Park" in the Dobbinsville neighborhood as not practical.

## Goodbye Bright House Field Hello Spectrum Field



There's a new name for the spring home of the Philadelphia Phillies, as Bright House Field is now Spectrum Field after a corporate merger created some new branding from Charter.

Bright House Networks was acquired by Charter Communications in 2016, and Bright House's services were rebranded as Spectrum. Therefore, it seemed inevitable that Charter would place the Spectrum brand on the ballpark.

The Spectrum brand has been added to more than one sports facility over the last several months. Last August, Charter's purchase of Time Warner Cable led to a change in identity for the home of the NBA's Charlotte Hornets, as Time Warner Cable Arena became the Spectrum Center.





## BAKED MOSTACCIOLI



*This baked mostaccioli is classically delicious and couldn't be any easier to make. Pasta baked in a delicious tomato sauce topped with cheese. So good! Mostaccioli is a pain in the you-know-what to spell, so I'm warning you now that you might see it spelled many ways.*

**So. Who's ready for a carbtastic pasta dinner? Let's roll...**

- Start by chopping up one white onion {on the small side} and smashing, peeling and mincing 4 or 5 medium cloves of garlic.
- Throw two pounds of ground beef {sirloin, chuck, round... doesn't matter} into a large pot or a Dutch oven. (former NJ colleague substituted one pound of beef for one pound of Italian sausage)
- Throw in the onions and garlic and turn up the heat to medium.
- Once the beef has cooked and the onions are soft, measure and add in the teaspoon of basil and oregano, 2 pinches of Italian seasoning and a generous pinch of red pepper flakes.
- Stir it all around...And pour in one 28 ounce can of tomato sauce.
- Add an eighth of a cup of Parmesan to the sauce along with the teaspoon of sugar, salt and a 1/4 teaspoon ground black pepper.
- Stir all that jazz together, cover, reduce the temperature to low and simmer for 15 minutes, which is just enough time to make the pasta.
- Here is the pasta. It's penne minus the ridges. I'm going out on a limb, but I'm thinking that's what that last word means.
- Lisce = minus the ridges. Hmm. Bring a pot of water to a boil and add in half of the box. Cook for half of the time that the package suggests.
- Drain...Toss the partially-cooked pasta into the sauce and toss to coat. Sprinkle with half of the grated mozz. {1-1/2 cups}
- Spoon out the rest and layer it on top. This time sprinkle with half of the remaining parm.
- Top with the remaining mozzarella...And sprinkle with the remaining grated Parmesan cheese. Bake in a preheated 325° oven for 40-45 minutes or until the cheese is golden.

Serve this scrumptious baked mostaccioli with a Caesar salad a baguette and wine and call it dinner.

Shake well and strain into a rocks glass filled with fresh ice.

Carefully pour the wine over the back of a spoon so it floats on top of the drink.

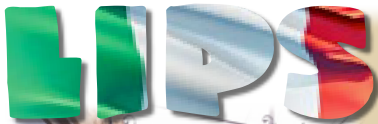


## George Read house named national historic landmark

The house of a Delaware colonial-era figure whose father signed both the Declaration of Independence and the U.S. Constitution has been added to the list of national historic landmarks.

The designation announced this week makes the George Read II House, on The Strand in New Castle, the 14th National Historic Landmark in Delaware and one of approximately 2,500 landmarks nationwide.
