20 The movie **In Old Arizona** was released. The film was the first full-length talking film to be filmed outdoors. 1925, **Get a Job** by **The Silhouettes**, was released. 1958, **The Beatles** release **Meet the Beatles**, their first album to the U.S. 1964, At 69 years, 349 days, **Ronald Reagan** becomes the oldest person to become U.S. president. 1981

21 The first issue of the **Daily News**, edited by Charles Dickens, was published. 1846, In NYC, the **Sullivan Ordinance** was passed. It made smoking in public places by women **illegal**. The measure was vetoed by Mayor **George B. McClellan Jr.** two weeks later. The first **Kiwanis Club** is formed in Detroit. 1915, Sci-fi writer **George Orwell** dies. 1950, **The Graduate** soundtrack was released. 1968

22 **Queen Victoria** died after reigning for nearly 64 years. 1901, **Fidel Castro** was ejected from a Winter League baseball game after hitting a batter. He then gave up baseball for politics. 1951, A historic Supreme Court decision in **Roe v. Wade** legalizes abortion. 1973

23 Congress decided **all national elections** would be held on the first Tuesday after the first Monday in November. 1845, **Charles Curtis** of Kansas began serving in the US Senate. He was the first American Indian to become a U.S. Senator, resigning in March of 1929 to become President Hoover's Vice President.

1907, NFL **Dallas Texans** become **Baltimore Colts**. 1953, **Terry Kath** (*Chicago*) died after accidentally shooting himself in the head with a pistol he didn't know was loaded. He was 32 years old. 1978

Sadye changed her name to Mary Livingstone. 1927, **Mary Martin** recorded **My Heart Belongs to Daddy**. 1940 The **first Emmy** awards were given out. 1949, **John F. Kennedy** presented the first live presidential news conference from Washington carried on radio and television. 1961

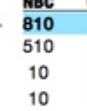

Smashed and Loaded Crispy Potatoes

Cooking potatoes twice—once in water, and a second time in hot oil—is hands-down the best way to achieve extra-crispy potatoes at home. And while there's nothing wrong with a plate of crunchy, well-seasoned spuds, smothering them in all of the best parts of a baked potato—helloooooo, bacon and sour cream!

- 2 lb. fingerling or other small potatoes - Kosher salt
- 1-2 oz. piece Parmesan - 1 lg bunch chives - ½ cup sour cream - 2 tbsp. hot sauce - 5 oz. Bacon - 4 tbsp. extra-virgin olive oil, divided - Freshly ground black pepper.

Place potatoes in a large pot and cover with water by 2". Add 3 large fistfuls of salt and heat over medium-high. Finely grate 2 oz. Parmesan. Thinly slice 1 large bunch chives and transfer to a small bowl. Combine ½ cup sour cream and 2 tbsp hot sauce in another small bowl. Add a teaspoon or two of water to thin it out to drizzlable consistency. Cook bacon and crumble.

It's time to check on those potatoes. Once the potatoes come to a simmer, they need to cook until a fork or paring knife easily slides into one without much resistance, and fall apart. Drain potatoes and transfer to a large rimmed baking sheet or a cutting board. Let cool slightly, about 3 minutes.

Using the bottom of a measuring cup or flat bottomed mug, smash each potato gently by pressing down evenly. Heat reserved bacon skillet over medium heat. If the pan isn't fully coated with bacon fat, add a good drizzle of oil. You want to make sure that there's enough fat in the pan at all times so that each potato gets a piece of the action. Arrange half of potatoes in a single layer in skillet. Season with salt and cook, undisturbed, until golden brown and crisp underneath, 6-7 minutes. Flip with a spatula, add 2 tbsp oil, and continue to cook on opposite side until golden brown and edges are crisp, 5-6 minutes more. Transfer to a platter. Heat remaining potatoes and 2 tbsp oil in skillet over medium. Season with salt and repeat browning, adding more oil if the pan gets dry. Crumble bacon and scatter half over potatoes. Sprinkle half of Parmesan over. Drizzle sour cream sauce over. Sprinkle half of chives evenly over. See the [VIDEO](#)

- 1 cup heavy cream or half and half
- 375 ml. Irish Whiskey
- 1 - 14 oz. can sweetened condensed milk • 3 tbsp chocolate syrup (She used Torani dark chocolate sauce)
- 1 tsp vanilla • 1 tsp instant coffee. Put all ingredients in blender and blend for about 30 -45 seconds. Store in the refrigerator for up to 2 months, although she doubts hers will last 2 weeks! Serve over ice!
