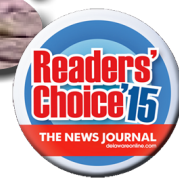

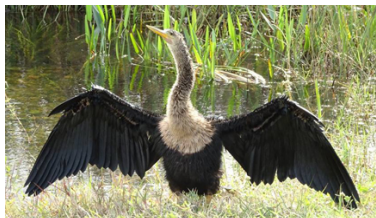

24 The first Boy Scout troop was organized by **Robert Baden-Powell**. 1908, **Beer** was first sold in cans. "Krueger Cream Ale" 1935, **Elvis Presley** recorded **Teddy Bear**. 1957 **Willie Shoemaker** topped Eddie Arcaro's career earnings record by riding four winners at Santa Anita. 1964, **Winston Churchill** died at the age of 90. 1965, **Penny Harrington** became the first woman police chief of a major city. She assumed the duties as head of the Portland, Oregon, force of 940 officers and staff. 1985

25 **Eliakim Spooner** patented the seeding machine. 1799, **G.D. Dows** patented the ornamental soda fountain. 1870, **Jack Benny** married **Sadye Marks** on this day. 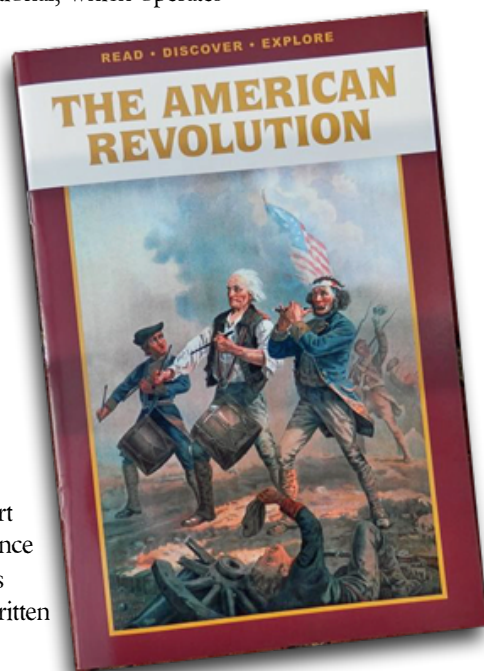

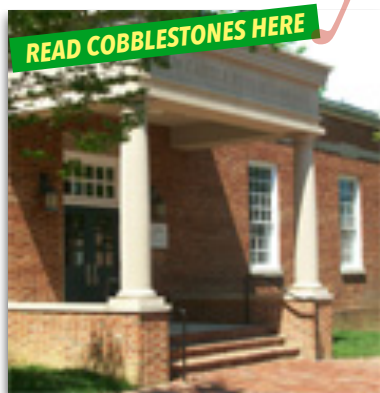

Confederate Waffles



Mrs. Hubbard's Way

The identity of Mrs. Hubbard remain a mystery, although there was a Confederate colonel who could have known the family through politics. The recipe is not labeled as "Confederate" in the family papers. It may have been an addition for publication in "Maryland's Way," cookbook. An employee at MDHS was so kind as to look into the Brune family papers for me, adding that they do not know whether the Brunes were confederate sympathizers but "it seems likely, because if you were in rich in Baltimore." The name could possibly be a play on the corn-based Johnnycakes, which originate in New England.

Original Recipe

1 cup corn meal - 2 cups boiling water
4 tbsp butter (optional: use part bacon grease)
2 eggs, beaten - 1 cup flour - 1/2 tsp salt
3 tsp baking powder - 2/3 cup milk

Stir cornmeal into boiling water until smooth. Add butter and stir until melted. Let cool before stirring in eggs, followed by flour, salt and baking powder.

Thin with milk & pour batter into heated waffle iron.

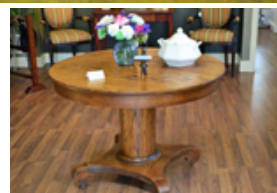

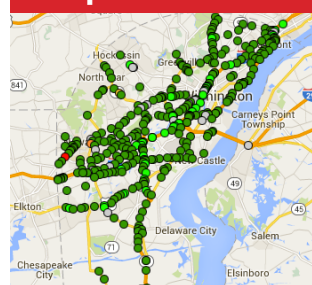

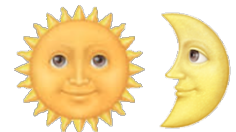
