OVEN BAKED PORK SPARE RIBS

**Icicles on the
Weber...outa
gas?**

If you like fall-off-the-bone ribs with great flavor and without the hassle, and got a hankering for juicy ribs, but don't want to go outside, go ahead and make them in the oven. You don't have to compromise on taste or tenderness! **(Serves 6-8...maybe)**



go get

2 racks pork spare ribs - barbecue sauce, your preference
1 cup beer **(that depends!)**

dry rub

1/2 cup brown sugar - 2 tbs paprika - 2 tbs fajita seasoning
2 tsp garlic salt - 1 tsp chili powder - salt and pepper, to taste

directions

Preheat oven to 250°

In a small bowl, combine dry rub ingredients

Prepare spare ribs by trimming the membrane (back of ribs) and tough meat (across the top), and discarding those pieces.

Dividing the dry rub in half, equal amounts for both racks, rub the spices on the tops and bottoms of the ribs.

On a baking tray and taking 8 pieces of aluminum foil, you're going to create pockets for the racks to cook in, meaty side up. 2 pieces of foil on the bottom, 2 pieces on the top, for each rack.

In a medium bowl, whisk together beer and barbecue sauce of your choosing.

Begin carefully sealing your foil packets. Before you seal the final edge, pour 1/2 of beer mixture into each packet.

Bake ribs for 4 hours. Remove from oven and carefully open your packets and drain the sauce/drippings into a saucepan. Simmer on low heat and let thicken.

Brush ribs with sauce and place back in oven, uncovered, under broiler, for 5-7 minutes. **Remove and serve warm.**



Tom and Jerry is a classic cocktail, which in many cases is forgotten, but quite often seen on the bar menus of many classic cocktail bars or older restaurants, especially during the winter time. Born **of rum and brandy, egg yolk and egg white, sugar and hot water**, the drink is one which befits the winter months. Served warm, the texture is like that of a chiffon cake, soft and velvety, with a lot of flavor in both the creamy foam and the liquid itself.

you'll need

6 eggs, separated
1/2 teaspoon cream of tartar
1 lb powdered sugar
1 (7 ounce) jar marshmallow cream
hot water rum brandy nutmeg

batter

1 Separate the 6 eggs Beat the egg whites with cream of tartar until stiff.
2 Mix in the powdered sugar - set aside.
3 Beat egg yolks until thick and light colored.
4 Stir in the marshmallow cream with a wooden spoon.

5 Fold egg white mixture into egg yolks.
6 Refrigerate all leftovers.

make your Tom & Jerry

7 Boil water.
8 Spoon several heaping tablespoons of batter into a mug.
9 Pour a shot of R&B (rum/brandy mix) or about 1/2 a shot each of rum and brandy.
10 (Or whatever amount you care for.) Pour hot water into the mug until fill.
11 The batter will rise to the top.
12 Sprinkle with nutmeg.



New Castle's other HISTORY

Taverns & such

James Antonio purchased Antonio's Café. He worked many hours and maintained a good place. The business was later taken over by his son, John.

Assunta Sulpizi operated a delicatessen which she opened in 1946.

Teodoro Yacucci operated a soda bottling plant from his home and the product was distributed locally.

Natale Alvin and **Alberto Zanni** opened the first sandwich shop in New Castle in 1937. Hot dogs and hamburgers were their specialty. Clams on the half shell were a delight. Richmonds ice cream and an assortment of candies were available.

Cass's sub shop was founded by **Anthony** and **Lena Castiglione** and opened in 1950. Steak sandwiches were their specialty.

Vincent Manetti operated Manetti's Restaurant featuring Italian foods.

Vincent and **Americo Coccia** operated the Pompei Restaurant for many years featuring Italian and American cuisine.

The **Federicci family** operated a restaurant at 2nd and Chestnut Streets between 1937 and 1940.

The following, although not closely related to the Italian Community in New Castle deserve mention since their businesses were within one mile radius of New Castle. They were **Vincenzo DelAversano** who operated a sand pit below the city. **Giuseppe Bosco** operated a tavern in the same general area. **Daniel Mattasino** operated Continental Block in Wilmington Manor, and **Giuseppe Rizzo**, a general contractor located above the city in the vicinity of the Delaware Memorial Bridge.

St. Anthony's Band

St. Anthony's band began in 1939 under the leadership of **Francesco Covelli**, **Giovanni Ioannoni**, and **Luigi Indellini**. There were 30 members in the band and it disbanded during World War II.

The Maestro, **Don Domenico Guadieri** from Naples Italy was brought to New Castle by the band committee. He was housed at the Yacucci residence and given employment at the American Brake Shoe Co (Abex).

The Maestro was a strict disciplinarian. Practice was held on the 2nd floor of **St. Anthony's Club** every Tuesday evening. Many former band members carried scars from the Maestro's baton, which he used to remind everyone when they hit a sour note or were not paying attention. It was a very good band, being called upon to play in the local St. Anthony's Day Celebration as well as other festive occasions for miles around.




