BUFFALO SAUSAGE Cheese Dip

ingredients

1 pkg. Jimmy Dean® Hearty Turkey Sausage Crumbles
1 pkg. (8 oz) cream cheese, cubed, softened
½ c. sour cream
¼ c. Louisiana brand hot sauce
2 tablespoons chopped celery
½ c. (2 oz) blue cheese crumbles
Baked pita chips or celery sticks for dipping



directions

1. Heat and stir sausage crumbles in a large skillet over medium heat for 4-5 minutes or until hot. Add cream cheese, sour cream and hot sauce.
2. Cook and stir until cream cheese is melted and sauce is smooth. Stir in blue cheese and celery; heat 2 minutes or until cheese is melted. Spoon into serving dish or chafing dish.
3. Serve with chips and celery sticks.

5Spicemule

This is an amazing winter cocktail that will have your palette busy with tasting pleasure! The carmel notes of the bourbon

complement the apple fennel shrub. Adding the bitters gives the drink complexity. We then finished the cocktail with ginger beer giving a final sparkle that brings it all together.

- 1 oz of [Bourbon](#)
- 2 oz [Apple Fennel Shrub](#)
- 6-7 drops of Bar Keep Chinese Bitters
- Splash of [Ginger beer](#) to taste

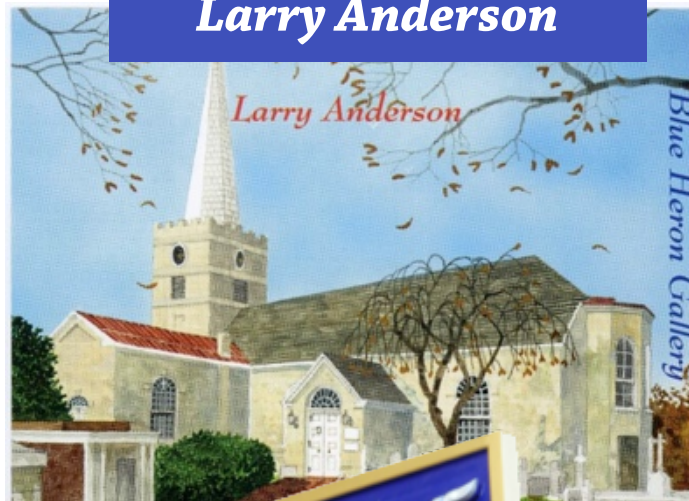

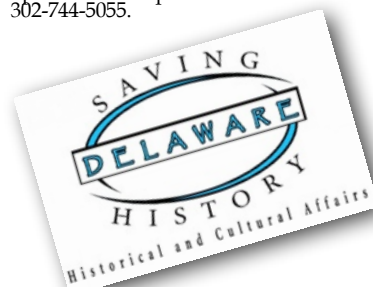
