## this week in HISTORY

- **27** John Baird, a Scottish inventor, demonstrated a pictorial transmission machine called television. 1926, Wire Recording Corporation of America announced the first magnetic tape recorder. The 'Wireway', Tragedy strikes the Apollo space program as a fire in the command module kills astronauts Lt. Col. Virgil "Gus" Grissom, Lt. Col. Edward H. White, and Lt. Cdr. Roger Chafee. 1967, President Reagan greeted the 52 former American hostages released by Iran at the White House. 1981
- **28** First *telephone switchboard* (21 subscribers) was installed in New Haven. 1878, The *Coast Guard* was created. 1915, Dodgers *Roy Campanella* was seriously injured in an auto accident. He would never return to play again. 1958, ◆ We Are the World was recorded. More than 40 artists were involved. 1985, *Challenger* explodes 72 seconds after liftoff, killing the seven crew members. Among the crew was school teacher *Christa McAuliffe*. 1986,



Feeling under the weather?
This follows:

Will give you the jolt of vitamins you need to get back on the path of recovery.

gonna need

1–1½" piece ginger, peeled, finely grated –  $\frac{1}{3}$  cup carrot juice–2 tbsp. fresh lime juice –  $\frac{1}{3}$  tsp. ground turmeric – A pinch of kosher salt –  $\frac{1}{3}$  lb. mixed citrus, such as oranges, blood oranges, and/or grapefruit – 1 mango, peeled, cut into  $\frac{1}{3}$ " irregular pieces – 2 kiwis, peeled, cut into 1" pieces – Crushed red pepper flakes (for serving) – Flaky sea salt – Extra-virgin olive oil (for drizzling)

## let's make it

Mix ginger, carrot juice, lime juice, turmeric, and kosher salt in a small bowl.

Using a paring knife, remove peel and white pith from citrus, being careful not to remove too much of the flesh. Slice citrus howeveryou want; you can slice into ¼"-thick rounds or cut into 1" pieces, and they don't even need to be an exact shape or size. Spoon half of carrot dressing in a shallow bowl. Arrange citrus, mango, and kiwis in bowl, then spoon remaining dressing over. Top with red pepper flakes and sea salt, then drizzle with oil.

A cautionary note; this cocktail does pack a punch, its mellow honey sweetness and warming bourbon base lends itself to slow, lazy sipping. Feel free to substitute rye for bourbon for a slightly spicier drink.

#### On the bar

2 oz bourbon -1 oz lemon juice 1 oz honey syrup\* Lemon twist, for garnish

Let's make one!

Combine the bourbon, lemon juice, and honey syrup in an ice-filled cocktail shaker. Shake vigorously until well-chilled.

Strain into an ice-filled old fashioned glass and garnish with a lemon

twist. \*To make honey syrup, combine 1 cup boiling water and 1 cup honey. Stir to combine, then let cool. This yields enough for 8 drinks and will keep, refrigerated, for 5 days.
