Sheriff's House ideas


Many concerned citizens came to the Court House last Tuesday as the National Park Service presented a look at the Sheriff's House Rehabilitation Plan. Built in 1857, the Sheriff's House historically served as both the home of the sheriff and as the administrative site for the attached together with the adjoining New

prison which, Castle Court House, served as the center of New Castle County's justice system. This structure is all that remains of the first county prison in Delaware. It was donated to the National Park Service by the State of Delaware in 2013. With over 70 participants voicing their hopes, concerns, and enthusiasm for the future of the Sheriff's House. NPS said "We are lucky to be among such an engaged community and will take each and every comment into account when working with planners to create alternatives for this summer's meeting, where we will call on the community to choose one of those alternatives. 



Ingredients

for 1 serving

1 banana • 2 whole eggs

a pinch to ¼ teaspoon of baking powder

1/2 tsp cinnamon • a few drops to a 1/4 tsp of vanilla extract

• 1 tsp butter or coconut oil to cook & grease pan (Personally, I'm a butter lover!)
1 tbsp pure maple syrup or Agave (I find these pancakes to be sweet enough as is)

## directions

Mash the banana in a small bowl.

**Beat** the eggs until smooth and add to banana. Add baking powder and cinnamon. (*Nuts, if using*)

Mix thoroughly.

**Grease** a nonstick frying pan or griddle well with the butter or coconut oil. (You don't want too much oil when you make pancakes.) Heat the butter or oil over medium heat for a minute or so.


**Pour** some of the batter until the pancake is about the size of your palm. Repeat with the rest of the batter, makes about 4 small/medium cakes.

**Cook** until bubbles form on the surface and the bottom is browning nicely, about 30 seconds more.

**Flip** the pancakes and cook for about a minute more, until bottom is nicely browned.

Repeat until all batter is cooked. They will be hot.
