### Sheriff's House ideas



Many concerned citizens came to the Court House last Tuesday as the National Park Service presented a look at the **Sheriff's House Rehabilitation Plan**. Built in

1857, the Sheriff's House historically served as both the home of the sheriff and as the administrative site for the attached

prison which, together with the adjoining New Castle Court House, served as the center of New Castle County's justice system. This structure is all that remains of the first county prison in Delaware. It was donated to the National Park Service by the State of Delaware in 2013. With over 70 participants voicing their hopes, concerns, and enthusiasm for the future of the Sheriff's House. NPS said "We are lucky to be among such an engaged community and will take each and every comment into account when working with planners to create alternatives for this summer's meeting, where we will call on the community to choose one of those alternatives. The Sheriff's House has a bright future as a key component of First State National Historical Park!"

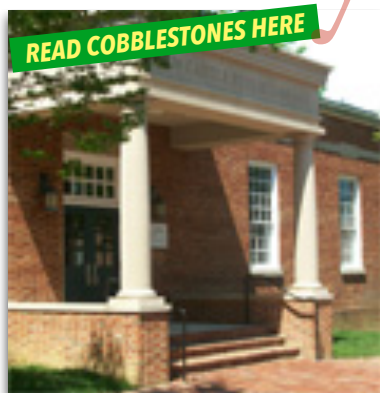

# flourless Banana Pancakes



Cobble Julie from Port Penn tells us "this is my new favorite breakfast". Teditor to make in the CobbleKitchen!

## Ingredients

for 1 serving

- 1 banana • 2 whole eggs  
a pinch to ¼ teaspoon of baking powder  
½ tsp cinnamon • a few drops to a ¼ tsp of vanilla extract  
• 1 tsp butter or coconut oil to cook & grease pan (Personally, I'm a butter lover!)  
1 tbsp pure maple syrup or Agave (I find these pancakes to be sweet enough as is)

**Note:** Add about a tablespoon of chopped walnuts as well, if so desired, but not needed.

## Directions

**Mash** the banana in a small bowl.

**Beat** the eggs until smooth and add to banana. Add baking powder and cinnamon. (Nuts, if using)

**Mix** thoroughly.

**Grease** a nonstick frying pan or griddle well with the butter or coconut oil. (You don't want too much oil when you make pancakes.) Heat the butter or oil over medium heat for a minute or so.

**Pour** some of the batter until the pancake is about the size of your palm. Repeat with the rest of the batter, makes about 4 small/medium cakes.

**Cook** until bubbles form on the surface and the bottom is browning nicely, about 30 seconds more.

**Flip** the pancakes and cook for about a minute more, until bottom is nicely browned.

**Repeat** until all batter is cooked. They will be hot.

**Serve** with syrup of your choice or non at all!

## CRITERIA FOR CANDIDATE

1. The term of office is twelve (12) years.
2. To be eligible to be a candidate for a Trustee of the New Castle Common, one must possess the qualifications of a qualified voter at said election and in addition shall have attained the age of twenty-five (25) years of age on or before the date of the election and shall have been a resident of the City of New Castle for a period of not less than two (2) years immediately preceding the date of the election for which such person is a candidate.
3. Any person intending to become a candidate for Trustee of the New Castle Common at any election held pursuant to the charter and ordinances of the Trustees shall, at least thirty (30) days before said election, until 5:00 p.m. close of business day, file with the Secretary at the Trustees' office a written notice of his/her intention to become a candidate, and pay the filing fee herein provided for.
4. When filing their names, as provided in Rule 3 of this ordinance, candidates shall pay to the Trustees of the New Castle Common, a filing fee in the amount of \$100.00 which shall be turned over to the Treasurer of the said Board for the partial defraying of the expenses of the election and this fee will not be returned in case of withdrawal of such candidates. No candidate shall be permitted to withdraw unless he/she shall do so in writing, filed with the Secretary no later than twenty (20) days prior to the election.
5. In order to be elected a Trustee of the New Castle Common, a candidate must receive an absolute majority of the total of all votes cast.

Where three (3) or more persons are candidates at a Trustee election, or where there are only two (2) candidates that are tied, and no one receives an absolute majority of all votes cast, there shall be a run-off election held on Saturday, April 2, 2016.

Candidates eligible to stand for election in the runoff election shall be limited to the two (2) candidates who received the greatest number of votes in the said election and who have not declined to permit their names to be entered in the runoff election; provided however, should a tie vote occur between two or more candidates for second place, such candidates shall then be eligible to participate in the runoff election.

6. In all elections for a Trustee of the New Castle Common, voting machines shall be used, except in cases of no contest and/or properly authorized absentee ballots.

Last Day to file to become a candidate:  
Thursday, January 28, 2016 3:00 p.m.

Last Day to withdraw a name as a candidate:  
Monday, February 8, 2016 3:00 p.m.

## QUALIFIED VOTERS

### ALL VOTERS MUST PROVIDE PROPER IDENTIFICATION

To be eligible to vote, a person's name must appear upon the registration list of qualified voters maintained by the Trustees of the New Castle Common.

If a name is already on the qualified voters list, a new application is unnecessary.

There shall be maintained by the Trustees of the New Castle Common in custody of the Secretary thereof, a permanent list of inhabitants of New Castle who

(1) Have owned a freehold interest in real estate for a period of one year immediately preceding the election in said City or

(2) Have rented a property in New Castle for a rental amounting to forty shillings (or \$10.00) for a period of one year immediately preceding the election or

(3) Are citizens of the State of Delaware and who are residents of the City of New Castle who shall have attained the age of eighteen (18) years on or before the date of the election and who shall have been a resident of the City of New Castle for a period of one year immediately preceding an election for the Trustee and who desire to be enrolled as a qualified voter at elections for Trustee of the New Castle Common.

Every owner and every renter and every resident of the City of New Castle who is a citizen of the State of Delaware and who shall have attained the age of eighteen (18) years on or before the date of the election and who shall have been a resident of the City of New Castle for a period of one year immediately preceding an election for Trustee as maintained in the preceding paragraph

shall have the right to have his/her name enrolled on such qualified voter list for any future Trustee election.

Open registration will be held, with proper identification, MTH 10 p.m. to 2:00 p.m. at the Trustees' office, 201 Delaware Street, New Castle, Tuesday, January 26th 6:00 p.m. to 8:00 p.m.

On Saturday, February 6, 2016 between 10:00 a.m. and 2:00 p.m. at the TRUSTEES OFFICE, Second & Delaware Streets, persons will be able to answer questions as to whether a name is on the list and to take applications to have names added.

Applications for absentee registration affidavits may be obtained until Friday, February 12, 2016 by applying in writing to the Election Committee, Trustees of the New Castle Common, 201 Delaware Street, P.O. Box 453, New Castle, DE 19720; absentee registration affidavits must be received no later than Monday, February 22, 2016, 3:00 p.m.

Applications for absentee ballots may be obtained from the Election Committee on the registration dates or by writing to Trustees of the New Castle Common, 201 Delaware Street, P.O. Box 453, New Castle, DE 19720. All written requests must be received no later than Monday, February 22, 2016, 3:00 p.m. Ballots to be received by Friday, February 26, 2016, 3:00 p.m.
