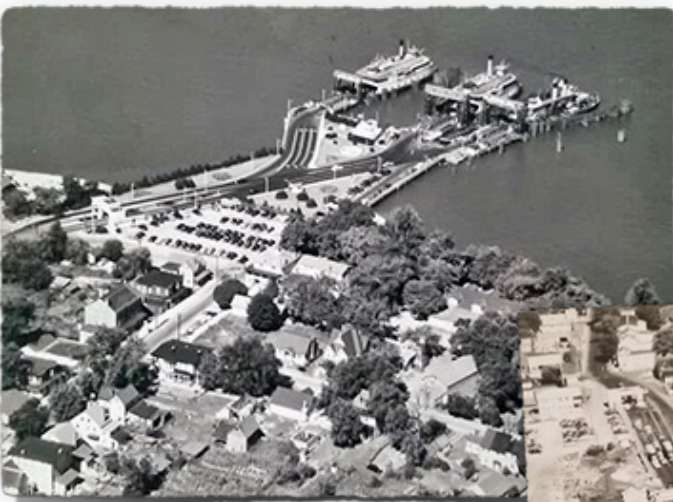

**The New Castle-Pennsville ferry** will stop its operations when the Delaware Memorial Bridge is opened August 16th—and for the first time in a couple of hundred years there will be no commercial line linking the two states by vessel.

Overjoyed as we all are at the prospect of using the bridge, there is nevertheless a bit of nostalgia in connection with the ferry line. In the earliest days of our history, the Dutch and Swedes in Jersey came across the river in their frail boats to attend church in the vicinity of Wilmington. Later, there were ferries linking New Castle with Salem but the service was not too dependable nor did it improve during the more leisurely 19th Century. Not until the modern era of transportation, beginning early in this century, was there any kind of regularity to the ferry schedules out of Wilmington or New Castle.

And from the 1920s until the present day the public required more frequent crossings—as many as possible in a day. But even the frequency of the trips could not meet the traffic problem until it became quite obvious that the ferry line out of New Castle had outlived its usefulness. The bridge was the only answer—and the ferry must bow out of existence. *Wilmington Morning News editorial*

The official game ball of the National Football League is stamped with the nickname "The Duke" in honor of Wellington Mara, the longtime owner of the New York Giants, who was named after the Duke of Wellington. Wilson Sporting Goods, the manufacturer of the NFL ball since 1941, named the ball after Wellington Mara to reward his father Tim Mara for arranging the contract that made Wilson the official supplier of footballs to the NFL. The nickname was originally used from 1941 to until 1970. After Wellington Mara died in 2005, "The Duke" returned to the game ball in 2006.

# FRENCH DIP SLIDERS



## GONNA NEED

5 tbsp. butter, divided - 1 large onion, thinly sliced - 2 sprigs, plus 1/4 tsp fresh thyme - Kosher salt - Freshly ground black pepper 12 slider buns, halved - 1 lb. thinly sliced deli roast beef - 12 slices provolone cheese - 1/4 tsp. garlic powder - 1 tbsp. clove garlic, minced - 1 1/2 c. low-sodium beef broth - 1 tbsp. Worcestershire sauce

## READY?

1. Make oven happy at 350°. In a large skillet over medium-high heat, melt 2 tbsp butter. Add onion and thyme sprigs and season with salt and pepper. Cook, stirring occasionally, until caramelized, about 15 minutes. Discard thyme.
2. Place bottom halves of slider buns on a large baking sheet and top with roast beef, provolone cheese, caramelized onions, and slider bun tops.
3. Melt 2 tbsp butter and brush on top of buns. Sprinkle with garlic powder, coarse salt, and parsley and bake until cheese is melty and sliders are warmed through, 10 to 15 minutes.
4. Meanwhile, make au jus: Add remaining 1 tablespoon butter to same skillet and melt over medium heat. Add garlic and cook until fragrant, 1 minute, then add beef broth, Worcestershire, and thyme and season with salt and pepper. Simmer until slightly reduced, 10 minutes.

**Kick back and serve sliders with au jus for dipping. Enjoy the Game!**

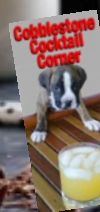

## A rich and creamy, warm version of the mudslide cocktail

4 tbsp unsweetened cocoa powder - 4 tbsp sugar - 1 cup heavy cream - 1 cup half and half - 1/4 cup strong coffee - 1 oz chopped semi sweet chocolate - 4 tbsp ea. Kahlua and Baileys  
2 scoops chocolate ice cream

In a saucepan, combine cocoa powder and sugar. Whisk in heavy cream, half and half and coffee. Continue to whisk over medium heat until sugar and cocoa have dissolved. Stir in chopped chocolate. Reduce heat and gently whisk mixture until the hot chocolate has thickened. Remove from heat and stir in Kahlua and Baileys. Divide mixture between two mugs. Add a scoop of chocolate ice cream to each mug; serve.

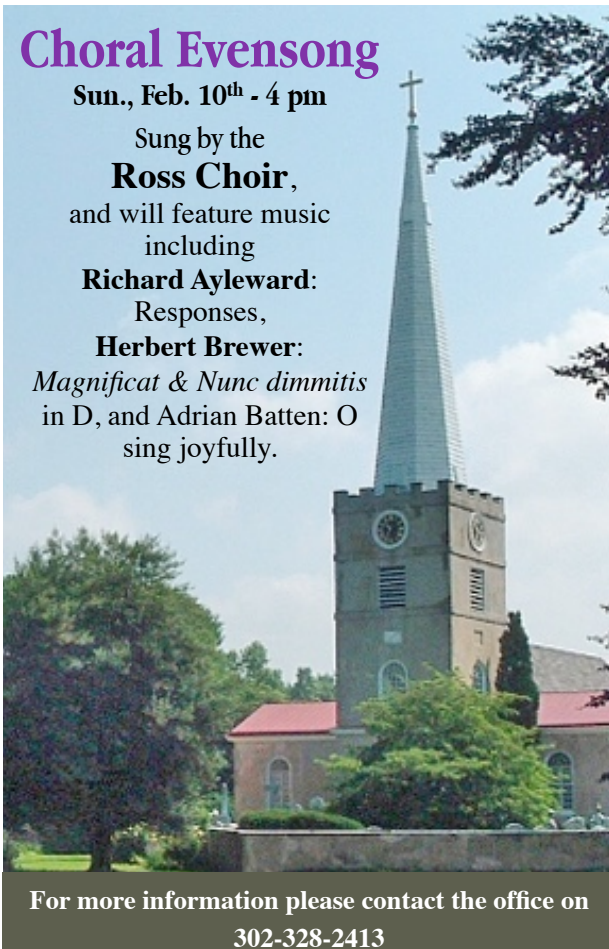

February 3, 1959, American rock and roll musicians Buddy Holly, Ritchie Valens, and J. P. "The Big Bopper" Richardson were killed in a plane crash near Clear Lake, Iowa, together with pilot Roger Peterson. The event later became known as **"The Day the Music Died"**, after singer-songwriter Don McLean referred to it as such in his 1971 song [American Pie](#).
