Delaware Georgian Farmhouse



The history: In 1657, a young soldier named Peter Alrich embarked from Holland on the treacherous journey to the New World. After being shipwrecked, he arrived in what would eventually become Delaware and was tasked with helping defend a Dutch fort from the British. Later he was put in charge of overseeing local land deals, during which time he paid 1,120 guilders (about \$640 today) for a 1,473-acre parcel where his grandson, also named Peter, later built this sturdy Georgian farmhouse. The circa 1760 house was home to many Alrich descendants before being sold to outsiders sometime in the 1800s.

Shown: The original structure was a single section with two rooms on the first and second floors. With two additions, the three-bedroom, one-bath house is now about 2,800 square feet.

ingredients

- 16 slices Soft Bread
- 2 Eggs ♥ 4 tbsp Milk
- 1/3 cup Sugar ♥ 1 tsp Cinnamon
- Filling of your Choice

directions

Place piece of bread on a cutting board and trim your crusts. With a rolling pin roll your bread flat. At one end of your bread place your filling (just a small strip) and roll up.

In a shallow dish combine sugar and cinnamon. Mix well.

In another shallow dish combine eggs and milk. Wisk well.

Heat a pan over low-medium heat, melt butter to coat pan.

Coat your bread roll in your egg mixture. Place in pan with your seam down. Cook until golden brown turning to brown all sides.

Remove the rolls one at a time from pan and roll to coat in cinnamon sugar mixture. **There you go!** Enjoy them however you see fit! They are amazing! Make them with peanut butter inside of them next? **Wonder how that will work out.**





Prepared mustard dates back thousands of years to the early Romans, who used to grind mustard seeds and mix them with wine into a paste not much different from the prepared mustards we know today.

The mustard seed is a prominent reference for those of the Christian faith, exemplifying something which is small and insignificant, which when planted, grows in strength and power. Pope John XII was so fond of mustard that he created a new Vatican position - grand moutardier du pape (*mustard-maker to the pope*) - and promptly filled the post with his nephew.

In 1866, **Jeremiah Colman**, founder of Colman's Mustard of England, was appointed as mustard-maker to Queen Victoria. Colman perfected the technique of grinding mustard seeds into a fine powder without creating the heat which brings out the oil. The oil must not be exposed or the flavor will evaporate with the oil.

We all know that losers and quitters can't cut the mustard (*live up to the challenge*). And perhaps the reason ballpark mustard is so popular is because pitchers apply mustard to their fastballs to get those strikeouts. The disabling and even lethal chemical weapon known as mustard gas is a synthetic copy based on the volatile nature of mustard oils.

Trustees Scholarship Announced

The "Trustees of New Castle Common Scholarship Fund" was established in 1983 for eligible residents of the City of New Castle.

An applicant must be a senior in high school or a recent high school graduate who is entering the freshman year in an accredited undergraduate college or university as a full-time student in the coming September. Funded applicants from previous years who continue to meet the eligibility requirements are invited to re-apply for grant funding if available.


