## CELEBRATE DELAWARE

As plans are being made to CELEBRATE DELAWARE not being an apPENNdage for 238 years there has been a buzz about town of Separation Day developing into a two-day event. True.

Being that Separation Day is Delaware's Independence Day, there is a concentrated effort to bring Delaware's various cities and towns together here June 13th and 14th. Invitations are being sent to cities and municipalities throughout the State inviting them to have a place on the Green to promote their uniqueness and events.

The Jaycees 5K River Run/Walk moves to Friday evening, before the family friendly events, activities and music that's being organized. When the necessary permits are finalized an outline will be announced. Delaware Street would be closed in front of the Court House for the evening. A regiment of Colonial reenactors is being planned. Food vendors and merchants are being invited to participate. Carnival rides would also be available and all evening activities would end at 10pm. These added Friday events would hopefully draw more out of town guests to the city and see the heart of our historic town and opportunities for future visits.



**Saturday:** Activities on this sunny pleasant day remain pretty much the same. The parade is with out a doubt, the most popular daylight activity of the day. This year perhaps BETTER!

An invitation is being extended to a very special Grand Marshal and a headliner musical entertainment venue. Battery Park again will be home to an offering of family entrainment. Some fees have increased. Arts & Craft to \$50 and Businesses to \$100. Community (food vendors) and non-profits remain \$0. Families are invited to register for the Beautiful Baby Contest during the Friday evening activities. And if it's possible, the fireworks display will be better than last years! Separation Day fireworks have become the benchmark for other east coast communities. So please

enjoy the entire day and come see the fireworks you'll be talking about all year!

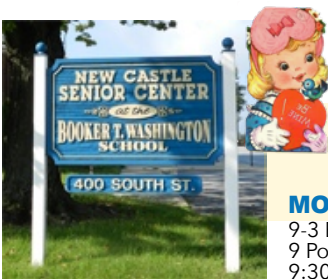

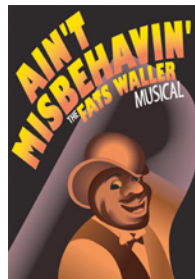

# ez pull apart PIZZABREAD

## INGREDIENTS

2 Cans of Pizza Dough or Biscuits

2 cups Mozzarella cheese (or your favorite cheese)

2 tablespoons of parsley flakes

1/3 cup olive oil

1 - 8 oz package of pepperoni (we used the turkey)

1 cup Parmesean cheese

## INSTRUCTIONS

Preheat the oven to 350 degrees

Cut pizza dough or biscuits into quarters (as shown in the photo)

Cut the pepperoni into smaller pieces

Mix all the ingredients in a bowl and toss so that the oil is spread evenly on each piece of dough

Bake for about 30 minutes (or until the top is brown and the center is thoroughly cooked)
