The Jaycees 5K River Run/Walk moves to Friday evening, before the family friendly events, activities and music that's being organized. When the necessary permits are



Galveston, TX after a drug sniffing dog detected pot when he was pulled over for speeding. Police then found diagrams of two indoor pot-growing operations and a plethora of marijuana seeds.

When police raided his house, they seized 1,000 marijuana plants and 9,000 rounds of ammunition for an assortment of 27 weapons — including a grenade launcher, because McGruff must have lots of enemies. After three years, Morales, 41, pleaded guilty and was sentenced to 16 years.


