criminal has this information, they are able to withdrawal or transfer your assets. We encourage you to immediately report anything that looks suspicious or out of place when you insert your debit or credit cards. You can also protect yourself by using a credit card or choosing credit when using your debit card. We also suggest that you review your accounts regularly and report unrecognized withdrawals to your bank.

Based on the responses we have already received, we wanted to send out more information about the **Amstel House project**.

A contractor will be repairing plaster and repainting nearly the entire interior of the historic house. To make sure all of our furnishings and artifacts stay safe, we need help moving them out of the way. This involves packing up small items and moving them in boxes to other rooms, moving small to medium sized furniture to other rooms, and moving the large furniture to the center of the room it is in and covering it properly.

We will be starting with the 2nd Parlor and the Kitchen since that is where the contractor will be starting on Feb. 22. We will also start moving the small items out of the remainder of the first floor. As the 2nd Parlor and the Kitchen are finished, we will be carefully shuffling items around to allow for the 1st Parlor and Hall to be worked on. We will then repeat that process for the 2nd floor.

BEEF BOURGIGNON



Clear the counter

1 tbsp olive oil, 8 ozs smoked bacon, diced, 2½ lb chuck beef cut into 1-inch cubes, kosher salt, freshly ground black pepper, 1lb carrots, sliced diagonally into 1-inch chunks, 2 yellow onions, sliced

2 tps chopped garlic, ½cup Cognac, 1 - 750 ml. bottle good

dry red wine, 1 can beef broth, 1 tbsp tomato paste, 1 tsp fresh thyme (1/2 tsp dried), 4 tbsps unsalted butter at room temperature, 3 tbsps all-purpose flour, 1 lb frozen whole onions, 1lb fresh mushrooms stems discarded, caps thickly sliced. **Serve with** Country bread or Sour Dough, toasted or grilled and rubbed with garlic clove, 1/2 cup chopped fresh parsley, optional

Now to create a this culinary masterpiece

Happy the oven to 250° f

Heat the olive oil in a large Dutch oven. Add the bacon and cook over medium heat for 10 minutes, stirring occasionally, until the bacon is lightly browned. Remove the bacon with a slotted spoon to a large plate.

Dry the beef cubes with paper towels and then sprinkle them with salt and pepper. In batches in single layers, sear the beef in the hot oil for 3 to 5 minutes, turning to brown on all sides. Remove the seared cubes to the plate with the bacon and continue searing until all the beef is browned. Set aside.

Toss the carrots, and onions, 1 tbsp of salt and 2 tps of pepper in the fat in the pan and cook for 10 to 15 minutes, stirring occasionally, until the onions are lightly browned. Add the garlic and cook for 1 more minute. Add the Cognac, stand back, and ignite with a match to burn off the alcohol. Put the meat and bacon back into the pot with the juices. Add the bottle of wine plus enough beef broth to almost cover the meat. Add the tomato paste and thyme. Bring to a simmer, cover the pot with a tight-fitting lid and place it in the oven for about 1 1/4 hours or until the meat and vegetables are very tender when pierced with a fork. Combine 2 tbsps of butter and the flour with a fork and stir into the stew. Add the frozen onions. Saute the mushrooms in 2 tbsps of butter for 10 minutes until lightly browned and then add to the stew. Bring the stew to a boil on top of the stove, then lower the heat and simmer for 15 minutes. Season to taste. To serve, toast the bread in the toaster or oven. Rub each slice on 1 side with a cut clove of garlic. For each serving, spoon the stew over a slice of bread and sprinkle with parsley. [Watch how to make this recipe.](#)

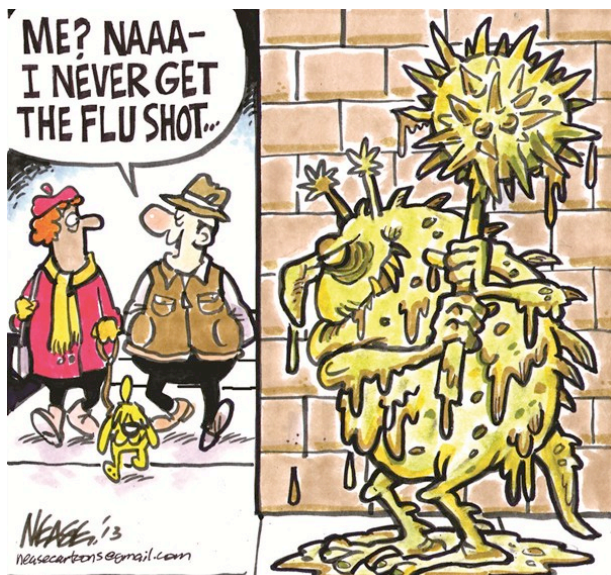

The flu vaccine is doing a poor job protecting older Americans and others against the bug that's causing most illnesses. Preliminary figures released last Thursday suggest the vaccine is **36 percent effective** overall in preventing flu illness severe enough to send a patient to the doctor's office. Most illnesses this winter have been caused by a nasty kind of flu called Type A H3N2. The vaccine was only **25 percent effective** against that type.

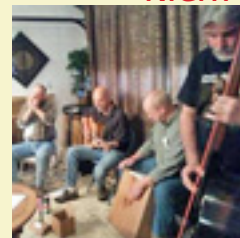
