hearty ranch **Drummond** classic recipe cowboys and life. She roast in a red wine- onions until the meat is juicy and the vegetables tender.

ingredients

Salt and freshly ground black pepper ❖ One 3 to 5-pound chuck roast ❖ 2 or 3 tablespoons olive oil ❖ 2 whole onions, peeled and halved ❖ 6 to 8 whole carrots, unpeeled, cut into 2-inch pieces
1 cup red wine, optional ❖ 3 cups beef broth ❖ 2 or 3 sprigs fresh rosemary ❖ 2 or 3 sprigs fresh thyme

directions

Preheat the oven to 275°

- ❖ Generously salt and pepper the chuck roast.
- ❖ Heat the olive oil in large pot or Dutch oven over medium-high heat. Add the halved onions to the pot, browning them on both sides. Remove the onions to a plate.
- ❖ Throw the carrots into the same very hot pot and toss them around a bit until slightly browned, about a minute or so. Reserve the carrots with the onions.
- ❖ If needed, add a bit more olive oil to the very hot pot. Place the meat in the pot and sear it for about a minute on all sides until it is nice and brown all over. Remove the roast to a plate.
- ❖ With the burner still on high, use either red wine or beef broth (about 1 cup) to deglaze the pot, scraping the bottom with a whisk. Place the roast back into the pot and add enough beef stock to cover the meat halfway.
- ❖ Add in the onions and the carrots, along with the fresh herbs.
- ❖ Put the lid on, then roast for 3 hours for a 3-pound roast. For a 4 to 5-pound roast, plan on 4 hours. The roast is ready when it's fall-apart tender.
