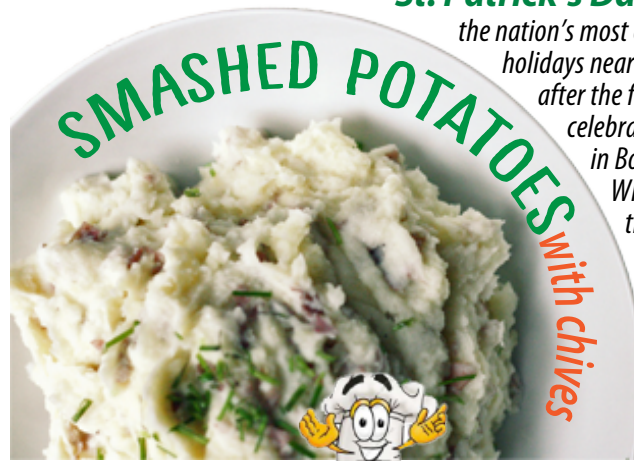

St. Patrick's Day remains one of the nation's most celebrated holidays nearly 250 years after the first American celebration took place in Boston in 1762. While a few traditions have changed, the ceremonial planting of potatoes around St. Patty's Day remains strong



INGREDIENTS

- 1 ¼ lbs Yukon gold potatoes (4 medium) unpeeled, cut into 1-inch pieces
- ¼ cup low-sodium chicken broth, warmed, ¼ cup sour cream
- 1 1/2 tbsp chopped fresh chives, salt and freshly ground black pepper

DIRECTIONS

Place potatoes in a steamer basket fitted over a large pot of boiling water. Cover and steam for about 15 minutes, or until potatoes are tender. Transfer potatoes to a large bowl. Add the broth, and coarsely mash the potatoes. Stir in the sour cream and chives. Season with salt and pepper, to taste, and serve. [Watch how to make this recipe.](#)

classic whiskey liqueur

- gonna need
- 1½ cups Irish whiskey (such as Jameson)
 - One 14-ounce can sweetened condensed milk
 - 2 tablespoons chocolate syrup
 - 2 teaspoons instant coffee
 - 1½ cups heavy cream

let's do it

1. In a blender, combine the whiskey, sweetened condensed milk, chocolate syrup and instant coffee, and blend on high speed until combined.
2. Place the whiskey mixture in a bowl and stir in the cream until smooth. Store the Irish cream in the refrigerator, covered, for up to 2 weeks. Serve chilled over ice. Yields 1 quart.

Need of some flowering companions to get you through the remaining days of winter?

The African violet, native to Tanzania, have few demands but will reward you with almost constant bloom if they are happy.

Though these dainty flowers may look fragile they are pretty tough plants and easy to grow on a warm sunny windowsill. The blossoms come in a wide range of colors.



SOIL: Use a fast draining African violet soil or make your own by combining equal parts potting soil, peat moss, and perlite or vermiculite.

Plants with multiple crowns can be divided, giving you more plants to enjoy or share with friends. African violets are easy to propagate by rooting a leaf cutting in water or vermiculite.

WATERING: Careful watering is the key to good African violet health. They like room temperature water. You can water them from the bottom by filling a saucer under the pot with water and letting it wick up through the soil. After 30 minutes drain off the excess; they don't like to have cold wet feet. It is perfectly acceptable to water from the top as long as you take care not to get the leaves or center of the plant wet. Overwatering will kill them, so allow the soil to dry out a bit before watering. Fertilize regularly with a water-soluble houseplant fertilizer or one made especially for African violets.

The weather outside might be frightful but these plants are delightful, and before you know it they will be blooming up a storm for you!
