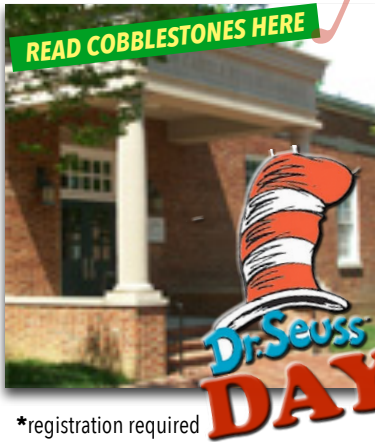

CILANTRO CHICKEN



Try this delicious and satisfying one pan chicken is super simple to make, the taste is anything but. Serve with a side of your favorite veggies and you've got a perfect weeknight dinner for the whole family!

GOTTA HAVE

- 4 boneless, skinless chicken breasts
- 1 c. low-sodium chicken broth
- 1/2 c. yellow onion, finely chopped
- 1/4 c. heavy cream
- 2 tbsp EV olive oil
- 2 tbsp unsalted butter
- 1 1/2 tsp fresh cilantro, finely chopped, plus extra for garnish
- 1 1/2 tsp freshly squeezed lime juice, plus lime wedges for garnish
- 1/2 tsp red pepper flakes
- kosher salt and freshly ground pepper, to taste
- asparagus

PREPARATION

1. Preheat oven to 375° and season chicken breasts with salt and pepper.
2. Heat olive oil in a large skillet over medium high heat and, once hot, add chicken.
3. Cook for 3-4 minutes per side, or until chicken is nicely browned. Repeat on other side, then transfer to a plate and cover with foil.
4. Return skillet to heat and add onion. Sauté for 3-4 minutes, then pour in chicken broth and lime juice. Season with cilantro and red pepper flakes.
5. Bring mixture to a boil, making sure to scrape up the browned bits from the bottom of the pan, and cook for 10-12 minutes, or until sauce is reduced and thickened.
6. Whisk heavy cream and butter into sauce until incorporated. Return chicken to skillet, then place in oven and bake for 5-10 minutes, or until chicken is fully cooked, yet still tender.
7. Remove from oven and let rest 5 minutes.
8. Garnish with remaining cilantro and lime wedges, and serve with a side of asparagus.

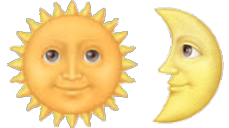

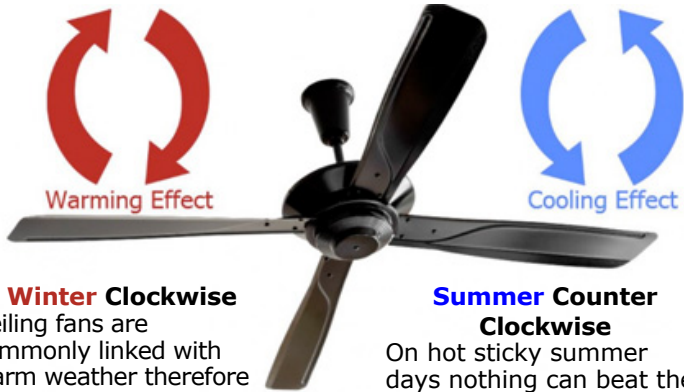

Cooling Effect

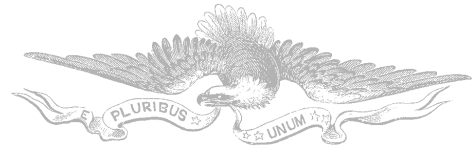


Winter Clockwise

Ceiling fans are commonly linked with warm weather therefore many people don't realize that ceiling fans can also help warm up a room in the winter months. In winter should be rotating clockwise. Warm air rises and gets trapped near the ceiling so when the ceiling fan direction is in reverse mode it circulates the warm air from the ceiling to the floor helping take the chill out of the air.

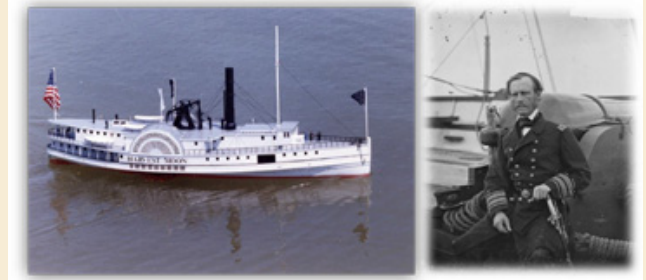
Summer Counter Clockwise

On hot sticky summer days nothing can beat the breeze you feel from a ceiling fan. A ceiling fan's direction in the summer should be rotating counter clockwise or forward to produce a downward airflow. The thermostat won't actually change but the room will seem several degrees cooler due to the wind chill factor.
