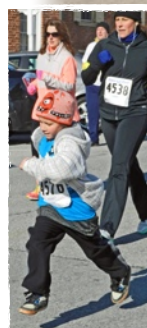

- 1½ cups soft coconut macaroon cookie crumbs
- 2 tbsp. margarine, melted
- 2 pkg. (8 oz. each) PHILADELPHIA Cream Cheese, softened
- ½ cup sugar • ½ tsp. zest and 1 tbsp. juice from 1 lemon
- ½ tsp. imitation vanilla • 2 eggs

Make It

HEAT oven to 350°F. Mix cookie crumbs and margarine; press onto bottom of 8-inch square pan sprayed with cooking spray.

BEAT cream cheese, sugar, lemon zest, juice and vanilla in large bowl with mixer until well blended. Add eggs, 1 at a time, mixing after each just until blended. Pour over crust.

BAKE 20 to 25 min. or until center is almost set. Cool completely.

- 1.5 oz jigger tequila
- ¾ cup freshly squeezed orange juice
- ½ oz jigger grenadine syrup
- 1 slice orange & maraschino cherry for garnish

In a shaker, pour tequila and orange juice and mix together. In a tall glass, fill with ice cubes and pour in mixture. Take grenadine and slowly add it in to allow it to fall to the bottom. Take orange slice and maraschino cherry and garnish.



Casablanca

- 2 oz white rum
- ½ oz coconut rum
- 4 oz pineapple juice
- 1 oz coconut cream
- ½ oz grenadine syrup

Mix all ingredients except for the grenadine. Blend with a glassful of crushed ice and pour into a Collins glass. Add grenadine and serve with a slice of pineapple.



Blue Lagoon

- 1 oz vodka
- 1 oz Blue Curacao liqueur
- Lemonade to taste
- 1 Cherry garnish

Mix vodka and curacao in a highball glass over ice. Add lemonade to the top and garnish with the cherry.

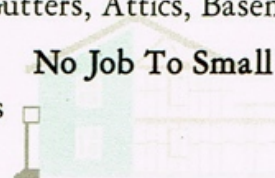

Come most Thursday evenings, the 'Stitching to Care' group

gather together at 'Trader's Cove' Coffee Shop at 6:00 p.m. to continue a program that has been ongoing since August, 2013. In that time, the group has knitted, sewn and crocheted 200 plus garments for the Bereavement Group at Christiana Hospital. They have packed to the brim, three baskets full of miniature dresses, booties, hats and other baby clothes.

Would you be surprised to know that in 2013 there were half a million babies who were born prematurely in the U.S? In Delaware that amounts to 1 in 8 babies born at 37 weeks or sooner. Many spend weeks in intensive care, but for some parents their child did not survive at all. It was stillborn, a term we instinctively back away from and do not even want to voice the word. It is an outcome that is a parent's greatest nightmare.

At Christiana Care, the Labor and Delivery Nurses formed a Bereavement Group to help these devastated parents. Using donations from volunteers, they dress these little ones in tiny garments that have been lovingly made for babies who will never go home. It truly is a labor of love, which is helping make a difference in the lives of distraught parents.

Can you knit, sew or crochet? Would you care to join us and help? In addition to making baby clothes, we also knit 'Chemo Caps' for the Helen Graham Center at Christiana Hospital, and usually there is a lot of laughter as we share together the events that have happened in our lives that week. We will happily share the patterns we use, and the tips we have learned together. Come join us: help make a difference in the life of a parent that will never be forgotten.

I was born premature at a time when little was known about "preemies." At 3 lbs., 4 oz. I was immediately placed in an incubator (from October 8 to December 2). I lost weight and nearly died twice. My father didn't see me for days. My savior was Dr. Margaret I. Handy, Delaware's first female pediatrician.

I'm lucky to have enjoyed good health and a good life. It's scary to think that there are still many parents in this day and age who must endure what my parents did and that many babies don't fare as well. There have been medical strides, but there are still many to be made. - Teditor
