





are one of the most popular and easy-to-care-for houseplants. With more than 2,000 varieties and counting,

these tropical plants come in a huge variety of shapes,

colors and sizes – any of them sure to make a unique addition to your home. Learn how to propagate these striking plants for months of exotic indoor blooms, and find some creative ways to display bromeliads in your home.

Caring for bromeliads

•Water the center cup or "vase" of the plant, and change the water in the cup about once a month. Occasionally water the base of the plant, making sure the soil dries out between waterings.

•Use a cloth rag to wipe away any dust that may collect on the foliage. Bromeliads have trichomes on the surface of their leaves. These waterabsorbing scales help the plant absorb water as well as shield the plant from solar radiation in desert climates.

•Place bromeliads in a bright location like an east- or west-facing window. Don't position them in direct sunlight that can damage and burn the leaves. THE VIDEO


Last Wednesday, February 27th at approximately 0930. the New Castle City Police Department executed a search warrant on a residence in the unit block of Juniper Street in Washington Park. The search warrant was obtained following an aggressive investigation targeting quality of life complaints.

Police recovered over 400 bags of heroin, close to 4 ounces of marijuana, two loaded 9mm handguns, a rifle and several different calibers of ammunition. Paraphernalia associated with heroin packaging and marijuana distribution was also recovered.

Jeffrey Lagasse was charged with several weapons charges

including possession of





Taylor Lagasse was charged with possession with the intent to deliver a controlled substance, conspiracy and possession of paraphernalia related to drug dealing. She was committed to WCI in default of \$7500 secured bond.

Skylar Saganich was charged with possession with the intent to deliver a controlled substance, conspiracy, possession of paraphernalia related to drug dealing and possession of a firearm by a person prohibited. She was committed to WCI in default of \$35,500 secured bond.
