



BRACIOLE

is a fantastic meat to add to your Sunday Dinner. (Wednesday's work too!)

You can add extra ingredients based on what you like, but this is a very simple and easy recipe to follow if you are not



GOTTA HAVE ALL THIS...

1½ lb flank steak ● 6 tbsp Parsley leaves (roughly chopped) ● 8 garlic cloves (minced) ● 4 tbsp of olive oil ● **S&P** to season ● 4 tbsp grated Pecorino Romano cheese ● Tomato Sauce ● Pasta

AFTER THE APRON IS ON...

● Lay out the flank steak on wax or parchment paper. Pound with a meat mallet. ● Season both sides generously with S&P. Sprinkle with olive oil. ● Spread garlic on top of the braciole evenly across the entire piece. Scatter grated cheese on top of garlic. ● Pile on the parsley!

Be sure to cover the whole steak!

- Get a little trick here. Roll it up tight enough not flop over and fall apart, but loose enough to let the sauce and flavors mix well.
- Secure with baker's twine. Have fun making different designs/knots with the twine!
 Heat dutch oven on stove top to medium-high heat. Place your bracioles in carefully and continue turning to brown on all sides. The inside does not need to be fully cooked, because it will continue to cook in the sauce. Add water if necessary to keep the meat moist.
 When fully browned, cover with tomato sauce and reduce to medium-low heat and let cook slowly for 2-2 ½ hours. This slow cooking will keep the braciole tender. Use a tomato sauce similar to Moms! I use whole peeled tomatoes and pureed them in a blender and add onions and red wine.
 Serve bracoile and sauce over pasta!

ONE MORE THING

Just remember to remove the string before you eat it.



Garnish with an apple fan, a mint sprig and a grape.



After Separation Day, right in your own back yard...the **Tall Ships Challenge Philadelphia**Camden 2015 lands on both shores of the Delaware River June 25-28.

Tall Ships Challenge is an annual event, which drifts in a three year cycle between the waters of the Great Lakes, the Pacific and the Atlantic coast.

Hundreds of thousands of visitors are expected to navigate their way to the Delaware to can catch a glimpse, step aboard and even **set sail on the massive ships**, which will all dock at Penn's Landing and the Camden Waterfront. Headlining the dozen-ship fleet of **Tall Ships Challenge Philadelphia Camden 2015** will be *L'Hermione*, a replica of the 145-foot long Concorde class frigate that brought General Lafayette to the aid of the fledgling United States during the Revolutionary War.

In addition to *L'Hermione*, the river will be dotted with both domestic and international ships, including the 295-foot long US Coast Guard vessel *Barque Eagle*, a replica of a late -16th century Galeon warships and *Gazela* – Philadelphia's official Tall Ship.

Credit for Daylight Saving Time goes to Benjamin Franklin, who first suggested the idea in 1784. The idea was revived in 1907. when William Willett, an Englishman, proposed a similar system in the pamphlet

The Waste of Daylight.

The Germans were first to officially adopt the lightextending system in 1915 as a fuel-saving measure during World War I. The British switched 1 year later, and the United States followed in 1918, when Congress passed the Standard Time Act, which established our time zones.

This experiment lasted until 1920, when the law was repealed due to opposition from dairy farmers (cows don't pay attention to clocks). During World War II, Daylight Saving Time was imposed once again (this time, year-round) to save fuel.
