# BRACIOLE

is a fantastic meat to add to your Sunday Dinner.

(Wednesday's work too!)

You can add extra ingredients based on what you like, but this is a very simple and easy recipe to follow if you are not experienced in making or eating braciole.



## GOTTA HAVE ALL THIS...

1 ½ lb flank steak ● 6 tbsp Parsley leaves (roughly chopped) ● 8 garlic cloves (minced) ● 4 tbsp of olive oil ● **S&P** to season ● 4 tbsp grated Pecorino Romano cheese ● Tomato Sauce ● Pasta

## AFTER THE APRON IS ON...

● Lay out the flank steak on wax or parchment paper. Pound with a meat mallet. ● Season both sides generously with **S&P**. Sprinkle with olive oil. ● Spread garlic on top of the braciole evenly across the entire piece. Scatter grated cheese on top of garlic. ● Pile on the parsley!

*Be sure to cover the whole steak!*

● Get a little trick here. Roll it up tight enough not flop over and fall apart, but loose enough to let the sauce and flavors mix well.  
● Secure with baker's twine. Have fun making different designs/knots with the twine! ● Heat dutch oven on stove top to medium-high heat. Place your bracioles in carefully and continue turning to brown on all sides. The inside does not need to be fully cooked, because it will continue to cook in the sauce. Add water if necessary to keep the meat moist. ● When fully browned, cover with tomato sauce and reduce to medium-low heat and let cook slowly for 2-2 ½ hours. This slow cooking will keep the braciole tender. Use a tomato sauce similar to Mom's! I use whole peeled tomatoes and pureed them in a blender and add onions and red wine. ● Serve braciole and sauce over pasta!

*Just remember to remove the string before you eat it.*

# GIN SMASH

*Paging all little green men: The interstellar dram of your dreams is here. The coordinates? Planted at the intersection of gin and muddled mint, green grapes and green apple.*

*Share with your leprechaun brethren on this, the greenest of drinking holidays.*

- 6 Mint leaves
- Quarter of a lemon
- 2 Seedless green grapes
- Eighth of a green apple
- .33 oz. Simple syrup (one part sugar, one part water)
- 1.25 oz. your favorite Gin
- Garnish: Apple fan, mint sprig and grape

*In a shaker, muddle the mint, lemon, grapes, apple and simple syrup. Add the gin and fill with ice. Shake, and strain into a rocks glass filled with fresh cracked ice. Garnish with an apple fan, a mint sprig and a grape.*

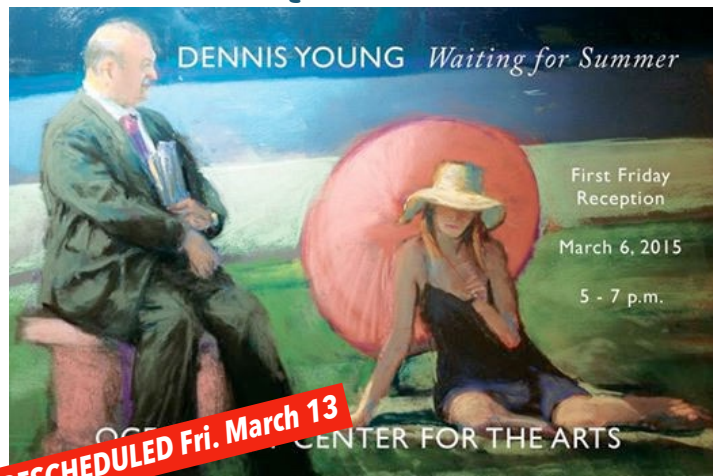

# tall ships

## *Billowing sails will waft*

in the breeze for four days when this traveling festival of sea craft sails past New Castle.

After Separation Day, right in your own backyard...the **Tall Ships Challenge Philadelphia Camden 2015** lands on both shores of the Delaware River June 25-28.

Tall Ships Challenge is an annual event, which drifts in a three year cycle between the waters of the Great Lakes, the Pacific and the Atlantic coast.

Hundreds of thousands of visitors are expected to navigate their way to the Delaware to catch a glimpse, step aboard and even **set sail on the massive ships**, which will all dock at Penn's Landing and the Camden Waterfront. Headlining the dozen-ship fleet of **Tall Ships Challenge Philadelphia Camden 2015** will be *L'Hermione*, a replica of the 145-foot long Concorde class frigate that brought General Lafayette to the aid of the fledgling United States during the Revolutionary War.

In addition to *L'Hermione*, the river will be dotted with both domestic and international ships, including the 295-foot long US Coast Guard vessel *Barque Eagle*, a replica of a late-16th century Galeon warships and *Gazela* - Philadelphia's official Tall Ship.

## *You'd think*



that with a face like mine everyone with whom I crossed paths in Wilmington would remember me, but I don't believe any one does. I arrived in Wilmington in February of 1938 and every year thereafter I was in Wilmington for at least a week, sometimes longer. I'm quite sure that even after all these years all of the kids would know me if I popped up in their living rooms and opened my mouth. After my initial arrival at the post office on Rodney Square, I was carried along with two reels of celluloid film to the projection booth at the Warner Theater which, as I remember, was in the 200 block of Delaware Avenue, right next to the building where Jimmy Caras, the world champion pool player operated his father's pool hall. The opening day of our film was a Saturday afternoon matinee. I remember there was a line of kids with their parents, which stretched nearly around the block. After the movie, though, even if I had been standing on the sidewalk outside the theater, no one would have recognized me, either, so I can't really complain that those of you who are reading this "interview" with me don't recognize me now. I suppose that it's also true that the illustrious leaders of Wilmington were largely unrecognizable in those days, too. How many people would recognize the men who were the presidents of one of the great banks which were then so important in Wilmington: Wilmington or Delaware Trusts, the Bank of Delaware, the Farmers Bank, or even the Wilmington Savings Fund Society? Not many, I reckon. How many people would recognize those members of the du Pont family who directed the fortunes of the big chemical company, which was headquartered close to that post office where I made my entrance onto the Wilmington scene? I would guess that not many people could identify H.B. or Irénée or even Willie du Pont from among the throngs of nicely dressed businessmen who walked the sidewalks of Wilmington in those days. So I guess I can't really complain that even though I'm known to nearly everyone who once lived in Wilmington, you wouldn't recognize me, either. My name is Billy Gilbert and I am the voice of Sneezzy in Walt Disney's movie, *Snow White and the Seven Dwarfs*. And since so many of you have said this to me, it's time I returned your many blessings: "May God bless you, too!"

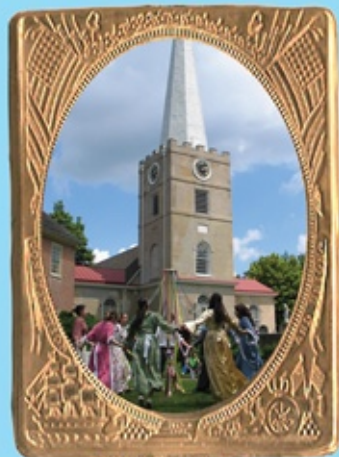

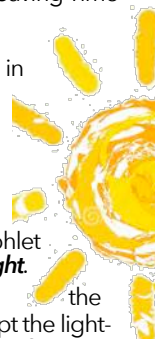

## DAYLIGHT SAVING TIME

Credit for Daylight Saving Time  
goes to Benjamin  
Franklin, who first  
suggested the idea in  
1784. The idea was  
revived in 1907,  
when William  
Willett, an  
Englishman,  
proposed a similar  
system in the pamphlet  
**The Waste of Daylight.**

The Germans were the  
first to officially adopt the light-  
extending system in 1915 as a  
fuel-saving measure during World  
War I. The British switched 1 year  
later, and the United States  
followed in 1918, when Congress  
passed the Standard Time Act,  
which established our time zones.

This experiment lasted until  
1920, when the law was repealed  
due to opposition from dairy  
farmers (cows don't pay attention to  
clocks). During World War II,  
Daylight Saving Time was  
imposed once again (this time,  
year-round) to save fuel.
