All of the remaining dike projects will resume a normal schedule this week.

Red Lion Dike Semi-final inspection was held on 12/19/13. Final inspection and acceptance to occur in June.

Army Creek Dike The riverside is 90% complete. The contractor needs to place additional riprap in some areas to get to the specified thickness. Anticipated completion date is April 18th.

Gambacorta Dike Improvements approximately 85% complete. The contractor has completed the protected side and river side improvements. The remaining work to be completed is the placement of curb and paving at the end of 3rd Street, and the path improvements. Anticipated completion date is April 18th.

Buttonwood Dike Improvements approximately 70% complete. The riverside is 80% complete. Anticipated completion date is unknown.

Broad Marsh Dike Improvements approximately 15% complete. Little work has taken place on this contract due to the weather. Anticipated completion date is May 30th.



Construction and inspections to resume



on the Reedy Point Bridge south of Delaware City on **Tuesday**, closing a lane of traffic by 7 a.m.

Traffic flow will again be directed by temporary

traffic signals at either end of the bridge.

Work had been suspended during the winter due to weather conditions. Additional steel repairs, sandblasting and painting are expected to continue into the summer, according to the U.S. Army Corps of Engineers, which owns and maintains the structure.

The project was supposed to conclude last year but was expanded from a \$7 million project to a \$10 million one to include the bridge's approach spans, as well as the main span. The contractor (*Corcon Construction*) is from Lowellville, Ohio.

well here's a strange name of a recipe



toad in the hole



Not to be confused with eggs in the basket (an egg cooked in a hole cut in toast),

toad in the hole is a distinctly

British recipe combining two very British foods: sausage, and Yorkshire pudding. **toad in the hole** is a relatively simple dish ingredient-wise, however it can be hard to perfect. The trick is to preheat the casserole dish. Serve this meal with an onion gravy, or a mustard, and with a side of vegetables and mashed potatoes. *Keep reading below for this wonderful recipe...*



gotta get at market

- ◆ 1 1/2 cups all purpose flour
- ◆ 1 tsp kosher salt
- ◆ a pinch of black pepper
- ◆ 3 eggs, beaten
- ◆ 1 1/2 cups milk
- ◆ 4 tbsps melted butter
- ◆ 2 sprigs fresh rosemary
- ◆ 1 tbsp vegetable oil
- ◆ 1lb bangers (British sausages) or good quality sausage links
- ◆ 2 large yellow onions chopped
- ◆ 2 cloves garlic, chopped
- ◆ 1 tsp fresh thyme
- ◆ 6 tbsps balsamic vinegar
- ◆ 1 tbsp beef bullion cube

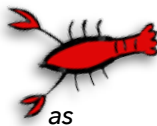
and the how-to-do

1. In a large bowl, whisk together the flour, salt, and pepper. Make a well in the center of the flour. Pour in the eggs, milk, and 2 tbsps melted butter and whisk until the flour is smooth. Cover and let stand 30 minutes.
2. Coat the bottom and sides of an 8"x12" casserole dish with a high smoke point vegetable oil. Set the oven rack in the lower-third of the oven. Place the empty casserole dish on the rack and preheat the oven to 425F.
3. While the oven is heating, heat a tbsp of oil on a skillet on medium heat. Add the sausages and brown them on at least a couple sides. When the sausages have browned and the dish in the oven is hot, pull the oven rack out a bit. Put the sausages in the casserole dish, and pour the batter over the sausages, throwing the sprigs of rosemary in with the batter. Cook for 20-30 minutes, or until the batter is risen and golden. Do not open the oven too soon, or the batter will collapse.
4. While the dish cooks, cook the onions and remaining 2 tbsps butter in the skillet until the onions have softened and browned (about 5 minutes). Add the garlic and thyme and sauté 30 seconds or until fragrant. Add the balsamic vinegar and cook it down to about half. Add the bullion cube and stir. Sprinkle with a little water, let simmer, then serve with the toad in the hole.



Notes for foodies...

Due to the extremely cold winter, even for the bayou country, crawfish are now a treat as price have doubled to \$8/lb across Louisiana. Meanwhile 1,650 miles to the northeast, Maine reports robust catches of lobster which may lead to enlarging their regional fishing area! That's good news!



Now for the fussy folks across the pond. The European Union wants to ban the use of European names like Parmesan, feta and Gorgonzola on cheese made in the United States. They argue that the American-made cheeses are shadows of the original European varieties and cut into sales and identity of the

European cheeses. The Europeans say Parmesan should only come from Parma, Italy, not those familiar green cylinders that American companies sell. Feta should only be from Greece, even though feta isn't a place. The EU argues it "is so closely connected to Greece as to be identified as an inherently Greek product."

Wyeth's America in the Making* features 12 dramatic paintings, created by the artist in the late 1930s for a popular advertising calendar, and shows Wyeth's renowned mastery of stirring action and authentic detail.

Props from the artist's Chadds Ford studio, such as a life mask of Abraham Lincoln, a coonskin cap and a Kentucky rifle, will provide fascinating insight into how Wyeth created these paintings. The *America in the Making* paintings are on loan from the collection of the Brunner Art Museum of Iowa State University in Ames. An illustrated catalogue from the Brunner Art Museum will be available.

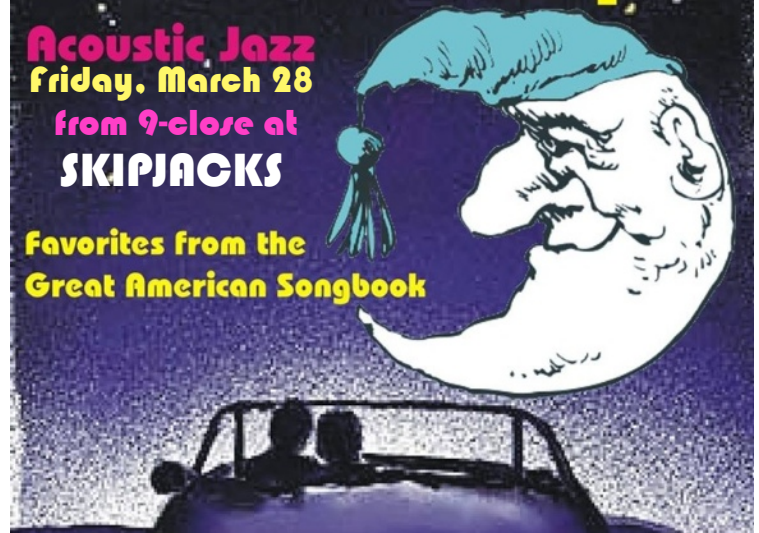

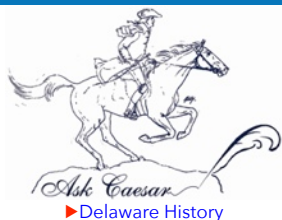
