City Council President Linda Ratchford attended a Future Trails of Northern **Delaware Coalition** kickoff meeting recently to support the City of New Castle's interest in trails and supporting Delaware Greenways mission of "Creating outdoor connections for active living & healthy eating." Along with Delaware Greenways they were at the Delaware Environmental

Center and watched the crane at work on the new bridge across the Christina River needed to connect Wilmington to New Castle-completion is expected in 2018. Recently reported in the News Journal the \$28 million project is about \$10 million more than what was estimated. The span will connect the southern edge of the redeveloped Riverfront with Wilmington's Southbridge, The bridge - which will feature two 11foot-wide vehicle lanes, along with 14 feet of bicycle and pedestrians pathways - will nudge Riverfront prosperity over the city's principal waterway and prompt growth in Southbridge. Buzz is missing because there's something serious going on with the world's bees. Bee populations everywhere have been declining at an alarming rate, and that includes honeybees like **Buzz**.

**Cheerios** is sending **free** wildflower seeds to anyone who signs up on their website help save the bees.

Bees, which play a critical role in our food supply, are dying globally at an alarming rate. 



## **New Castle mourns a loss**

Trustee of New Castle Commons, Francis D. "Chickie" DeAscanis, died late last Thursday at the happy age of 90.



During the 250th Trustees of the Common Anniversary Celebration, December 2014 then Trustee president Michael Alfree said he was most fortunate to preside told attendes "Mr.

DeAscanis has been serving the community as a Trustee longer than his entire working career. Only one member of the Trust, Richard Rodney, has served longer and that by only a month and a couple weeks."

Chickie first awaited election results in June of 1964 only to find he was headed for a run-off in November, which he won. In both elections a record number of votes were cast; 1,479 in June and 1,605 that fall. "Chickie's" half century of service began as he joined Jacob H. Speicher, Donald C. Banks, Richard M. Appleby, Sr., Nelson C. Quillen,

John C. Roman, James E. Carlin, Robert J. Quillen, Daniel F. Wolcott, H. Thomas McGuire, Horace L. Deakyne, J. Herbert Tobin, and Joseph A. DiMondi, as a member of the New Castle Trustees of the Common.



Do you just grab taco seasoning at the store

classic hard taco? You know...crunchy shells, ground beef, shredded lettuce and cheese, chopped tomatoes, salsa, and sour cream.

No frills, no fancy meat —just—the nostalgic food your parents made. It's a cinch to make yourself!

1 Tbsp. red pepper flakes in a spice mill or mortar and pestle until it becomes a powder. (You can substitute ground cayenne, but start with 1 tsp. and see how spicy you want it.) Add all the following spices into a jar\* and shake, shake: ¼ cup chili powder, ¼ cup sweet paprika, 2 Tbsp. ancho chile powder, 2 Tbsp. dried oregano, 2 Tbsp. ground cumin, 1 Tbsp. garlic powder, 1 Tbsp. onion powder, and 1 tsp. freshly-ground black pepper.

\*The type of container doesn't really matter as long as it's airtight, and it'll keep in a dark cupboard for up to three months. (makes about a cup.)

To make tacos, heat 2 tsp. of oil in a medium skillet (preferably cast iron for the best possible browning). Add ground beef and cook, breaking up into small pieces and scraping the bottom of the pan, until browned but not cooked through—approximately 6-8 minutes. Add 3 heaping Tbsp. seasoning mix and 1 tsp. kosher salt and stir until incorporated for about 4 minutes. Add 1 cup chicken stock and stir, breaking meat into smaller pieces, and then reduce heat to medium-low. Cook until liquid is reduced and mixture becomes saucy, 7-10 minutes. (If you've never added chicken stock to your taco meat before, you've gotta give it a try. It makes the taco meat so much juicier, you'll never make it any other way).

You can leave the pan on low for 30 minutes if needed and it shouldn't dry out while you prep the other taco fixins. You can also use the blend as a rub on pork, hanger steak for fajitas, chicken, corn, or other vegetables. Or maybe try doctoring up store-bought tortilla chips by putting them in a 250° oven until the oils start to release—and then toss them with the taco seasoning. You could also brush corn tortillas with a little neutral oil (like canola) and sprinkle them with salt and taco seasoning for spiced tortillas. If you fry 'em up, you've got tostadas! Your life needed more tacos, and this is the solution.

By June, nearly 300 British merchant ships and transports were anchored along Delaware's coastline. Many loyalist families, hoping to find sanctuary, left with these ships when the British evacuated Philadelphia. On July 11, Caesar Rodney noted that the enemy had entirely left the Delaware River, and that Admiral d'Estaing's large French fleet was patrolling the Delaware coastline. [20]

Things remained relatively peaceful in Delaware until summer of 1781, when thousands of soldiers, horses, cattle and baggage trains crossed New Castle County, following Philadelphia Pike to the Wilmington riverfront, then Maryland Avenue through Newport and Stanton to Old Stanton-Christiana Road. Turning west at Christiana, they followed Old Baltimore Pike into Maryland. Their destination was Yorktown, Virginia.

After Yorktown fell the war was effectively over, but there was military action in the Delaware Bay when British Capt. Josiah Rodgers of the General Monk ordered the American ship Hyder Ally to surrender. On April 8, 1782, American naval Lt. Joshua Barney replied with a broadside of grape, canister and round shot, killing some sailors and marines. He ordered his ship to port and unleashed another round of shot. The boats were so close that the enemies' shouted commands were heard. The quick-thinking Barney then gave his sailors quiet directions while in a loud voice ordering them to do something else. As he had apparently intended, the two vessels collided and their riggings became entangled. The Americans fastened the General Monk to their ship to prevent her breaking loose and fired broadside. After less than thirty minutes of close-quarters combat, the Americans captured both the General Monk and the Charming Molly. [21]

Further upstate, constable Robert Appleton's house was plundered by Loyalists who took him captive, hauling him to Bombay Hook. Joined

by six more men, the Loyalists demanded he preach a Methodist sermon. When he refused, he was whipped, forced to destroy official papers, and made to promise that he would never serve papers on Tories again. Serving another warrant a few weeks later, Appleton was again captured and beaten. [22]



While these things were taking place, soldiers continued passing through the state, all needing food, clothing, and supplies. Among those headed north that summer was the duc de Lauzun, returning to America from France. The whole trip had been an unpleasant adventure: We arrived off the coast of America, at the mouth of the Delaware ... at daybreak we sighted an English squadron of seven men of war bearing down upon us under full canvas. We were forced to raise anchor and enter the river without pilots ... M. de la Touche sailed two leagues farther up the channel, then seeing that no hope remained, decided to put ashore the packages from the court, the money, and passengers. We were put ashore about a league from the nearest habitation, without having brought away so much as a shirt a piece. I was still in a fever, I could barely stand, and I should never have been able to reach a house had it not been for a powerful negro who gave me his arm... the French and American doctors were agreed in their opinion that I must die before the end of the autumn... Then M. de Rochambeau sent one of his aidesde-camp with letters for the Chevalier de la Luzerne, and wrote bidding me do everything in my power to come to camp... I mounted a horse and rode to camp, death being no worse on the road than in Philadelphia.[23]

On April 11, 1783, the Continental Congress declared the cessation of arms against Great Britain. In New Castle, a peace celebration was held along the banks of the finally quiet river.



# SEEED STARTER



### Make a Homemade Propagator

A propagator creates a humid environment that seeds need to germinate.

You can make one with a 2-liter bottle. After cutting the bottle in half, insert a strip of cotton through the slit in the lid. This will work to wick moisture. Screw the lid on the top bottle part.

Add some water into the base part. Then, put the top bottle part upside down into it, making sure the water level covers the lid and the cotton wick. **Add Soil** and sow the seeds. Fill the top bottle part with soil. You are now ready to sow the seeds.

After sowing the seeds, cover with a small container. Make sure the container has holes punched in. Put the propagator in a warm and sunny place. If heavy rains are forecast, then be sure to put the container under cover.


