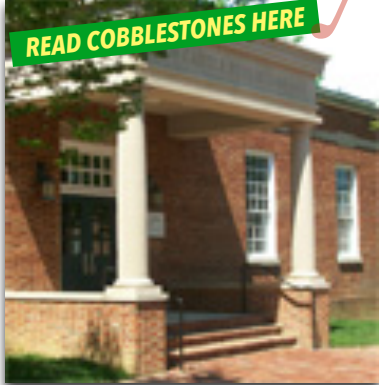

LEG of LAMB



with
mint sauce

*This is a recipe
that was
served
on the
Titanic's
fatal
voyage*

For this recipe, little is changed to really let those classic flavors shine. One of the strengths of this dish is in the marinating of the lamb at room temperature, and the browning before sticking it in the oven. You'll end up with a great crusty outer meat, and an incredibly tender inside that's practically falling off the bone. It's also important to save the drippings from the lamb after it's done cooking and to use those in the mint sauce for the extra flavor!

Ingredients

1 leg of lamb (3½ to 4lb) • 2 cloves garlic, minced • 3 tbsp olive oil • 2 tbsp chopped fresh rosemary • 1 tablespoon fresh thyme • 1 tsp Dijon mustard • 1 tps black pepper • ¼ c. wine* • ½ tsp salt

Mint Sauce

2 shallots, minced • ¼ c. white wine* • 1 c. chicken stock • 2 tps cider vinegar • 1 tsp sugar • ¼ c. chopped fresh mint • fresh mint sprigs

Directions

- ❖ Trim the lamb of gristle and excess fat. Use a paring knife to poke thin slits 1/2" deep all over the lamb (about 10 slits). Stir together garlic, 2 tbsp of oil, thyme, rosemary, mustard, and pepper. Rub over the surface of the meat, pressing the marinade into the small slits. Make sure the entire lamb is properly covered with the marinade, then let marinate at room temperature for 1 hour.
- ❖ Preheat the oven to 450F. In a large, heavy skillet, heat the remaining oil over high heat. Add the leg and sear, turning often for about 5 minutes or until well browned on every side.
- ❖ Place the leg in a large roasting pan. Pour the wine and salt into the skillet the lamb was cooked in, scraping up any browned bits. Pour the wine over the meat. Bake the lamb for 15 minutes in the oven, then reduce the heat to 350F, and continue to roast for 25 minutes for a rare roast, or 35 minutes for medium-rare. Remove the roast from the pan and tent with foil. Allow to rest for 15 minutes before carving.
- ❖ While the lamb is resting, place the roasting pan the lamb roasted in over medium heat. Stir in the shallots and cook, stirring often, for 5 minutes or until softened. Stir in the wine, bring to a boil, and cook. Stir often for 1 minute until the sauce is reduced to a glaze. Stir in the stock, vinegar and sugar.
 - ❖ Boil rapidly for 2 minutes or until the sauce is slightly thickened. Pour through a fine meshed sieve. Stir in the mint. Garnish with fresh mint sprigs and serve along side the lamb.

Serpent-less Swizzle

1.5oz Irish Whiskey • .75oz Vermouth
.75oz Lemon juice • .5oz Grenadine
Garnish: Mint and cherry

Easy to make!

Add all the ingredients to a Pilsner glass. Fill with crushed ice and swizzle vigorously until slightly frothy.

Garnish with a large sprig of mint & a cherry.

Blue Crabs Are Emerging Blue Claw crab season started on March first for pots, and year round you can use hand lines. The creel limit on blue crabs is one bushel per person. Hard shell crabs must be a minimum of 5 inches. Soft shell crab minimum is 3.5 inches, and peeler crabs are 3 inches.

DNREC ... "Recreational crabbers may not use, place, set or tend more than two pots. The person claiming to own the pots must be the one to set and tend them. These pots must be marked with all white buoys with the owner's full name and permanent mailing address inscribed either on the buoy or on a waterproof tag attached to the buoy. All crab pots must be tended at least once every 72 hours."

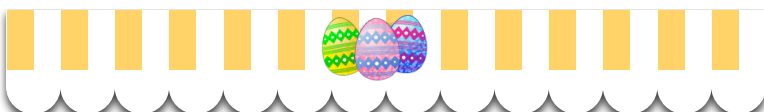

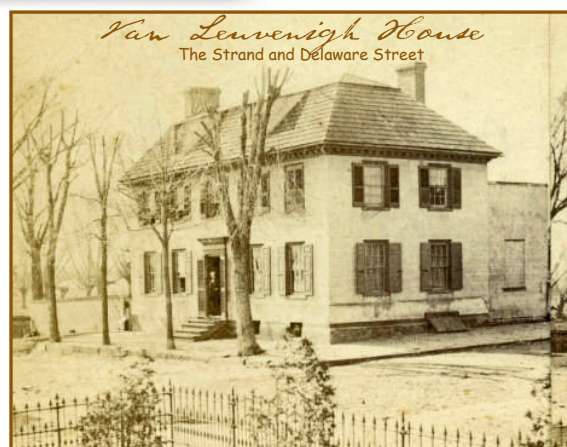

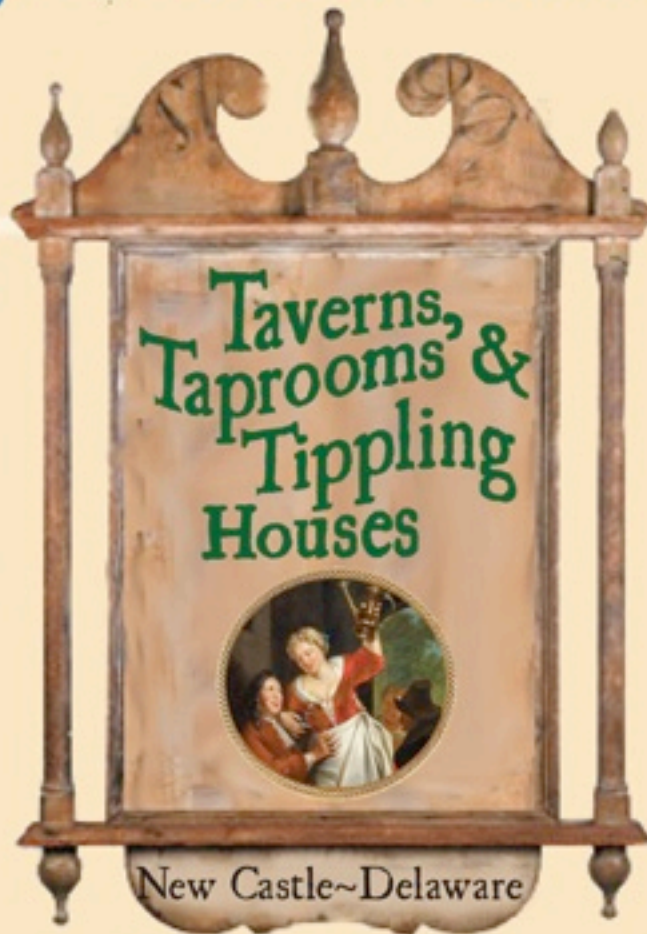
