Mayor Signs Emergency Declaration for the City of New Castle

City Offices Closed to the Public, but City Services Will Continue
Mayor Quaranta has signed an emergency Declaration on March 17, 2020 outlining

the City's response to the Coronavirus. City of New Castle offices are open for City personnel, but closed to the general public through at least May 31, 2020. At this time, City services such as trash, yard waste, and recycle pick up will continue as normally scheduled. In conjunction with the recommendations put forth in the State of Emergency mandated by the Governor, along with the recommendations by the CDC, effective immediately, the City is cancelling all public events through the end of May. The City of New Castle is taking every precaution to prioritize community health and well-being. During the coming weeks, following the direction of public health officials and the strong possibility of any unforeseen changes in circumstances, the City will revise plans as appropriate. We will continue to monitor this extremely serious and fluid situation and will provide updates as they become available. We strongly encourage residents and our business partners to check our website and Facebook page as often as possible for updates; or call the City offices with any questions at 322-9801. Thank you for your patience and understanding during these very challenging circumstances.

Governor Carney Announces Statewide COVID-19 Testing Plan

Friday, March 20: Governor Carney announced a coordinated statewide plan to ensure individuals with symptoms consistent with coronavirus have access to safe and efficient testing in Delaware. Tests will be administered at no cost to the patients.

The plan is a collaborative effort between the Division of Public Health (DPH), Delaware Healthcare Association, and each of the health care systems.

Beginning Monday, March 23, Delaware health systems will operate standing health facility test sites, where health care staff will test individuals who have been evaluated by a medical provider and have symptoms consistent with COVID-19. If you have symptoms, call your health care provider or the DPH Coronavirus Call Center at 1-866-408-1899 first to discuss whether you should be tested for coronavirus. A physician order or prescription is required.

Governor John Carney on Saturday issued a third modification to his emergency declaration. The new orders **close Delaware beaches** to help slow the spread of the coronavirus (COVID-19). The public is prohibited from accessing the beach except to exercise or walk their dogs where dogs are permitted. Local officials may choose to enact tighter restrictions.

These modifications go into effect at 5:00 p.m. tonight, March 21, and will last until May 15, or until the public health threat of COVID-19 has been eliminated.

"We need everyone to take this situation seriously. We saw too many people on the beaches yesterday and we weren't seeing the kind of social distancing that we need in order to slow the spread of coronavirus," said Governor Carney.

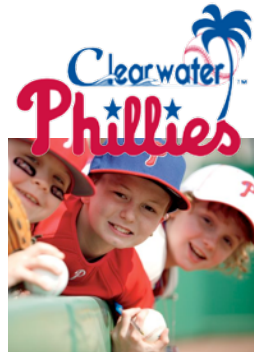

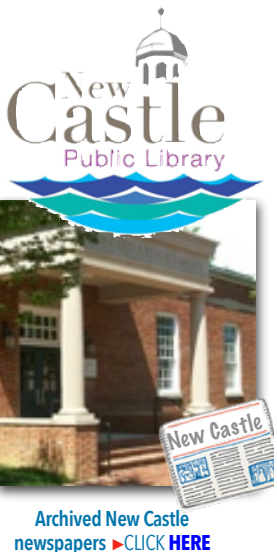

Boxty



Traditional Irish Boxty are the holy grail of pancakes for potato lovers! Combining mashed and raw potato with buttermilk makes a dreamy, yet simple meal. Also called Irish Potato Cakes, they are often made this time of year!

gonna need

9 oz (2 cups) all-purpose flour - 1 tsp baking powder - 1 tsp
Kosher or sea salt - 8 oz (1 cup) mashed potatoes, boiled in
salted water

1 ½ cups (8 oz) grated, raw potato (nothing fancy needed,
just a regular grater)

8 oz (1 cup) buttermilk (or more if needed) - butter for the
pan

let's make some

In a small bowl, place the flour, baking powder and salt; set
aside.

Using a large mixing bowl, combine the mashed potatoes
with the grated raw potato, then add the flour and mix well.
Next, slowly add the buttermilk and stir gently (do not over
mix).

The mixture should be like a very firm, thick batter; almost
like a dough, so add more buttermilk if needed (I just used 1
cup or 8 oz).

Heat a nonstick frying pan or cast iron pan over medium-high
heat, and add a pat of butter, just before scooping out some
of the boxty batter onto the pan. You are now cooking Irish
potato cakes!

Flatten and shape into a nice, round pancake shape and fry
until golden brown on the bottom.

Turn the boxty and continue to cook until golden brown on
top, too. Consequently, turn the heat down if they are
browning too quickly (remember there are raw potatoes
which need to cook).

Continue to add a little butter and fry the boxty until all the
batter is finished

SEED STARTER

Make a Homemade Propagator

A propagator creates a humid environment that seeds need to germinate. You can make one with a 2-liter bottle.

After cutting the bottle in half, insert a strip of cotton through the slit in the lid. This will work to wick moisture. Screw the lid on the top bottle part.

Add some water into the base part. Then, put the top bottle part upside down into it, making sure the water level covers the lid and the cotton wick. **Add Soil** and sow the seeds. Fill the top bottle part with soil. You are now ready to sow the seeds.

After sowing the seeds, cover with a small container. Make sure the container has holes punched in. Put the propagator in a warm and sunny place. If heavy rains are forecast, then be sure to put the container under cover.
