Last Sunday, 100 years ago, the brand new Ahrens Fox Fire Engine was delivered by rail car to the fire company. The pumper was placed in service almost immediately, handling its first alarm nine days after delivery and was in service until the 1955 "B" Model Mack was placed into service. After that, the Ahrens Fox sat in a reservoir status and then in various states of disrepair in garages around town. In 1986, Chief Grover P Ingle organized and initiated a full on refurb with Andy Swift and Firefly Restorations of Maine. After almost 4 years, the fully restored and fully operational Ahrens Fox returned to New Castle on December 20th, 1990. The Ahrens Fox currently sits in its own bay that replicates the old fire house. Still operational, the "Fox" can be seen leading the Separation Day Parade, on display during Day in Old New Castle and other events, and escorting Santa around town.

The good thing is, it is possible to cook a steak in the oven – and for the steak to be delicious. As long as you have a good cast iron skillet, a nice cut of meat, and maybe even a little butter, you'll be more than okay when it comes to cooking steak in the oven. Here's a ribeye steak recipe you're going to enjoy. Not only are you getting a beautiful cut of meat cooked in the oven, but I've added rosemary roasted potatoes and topped everything with a herbal, fresh chimichurri sauce. Together, these can be served with other roasted vegetables of your choice. If you don't want the potatoes or the sauce, I still recommend using the oil and butter as described in the recipe – the oil will help sear in the juices and the butter, well, who doesn't want a little bit more butter in their lives?

Need a drink to pair with this steak meal? Why not try a few fingers of one of these whiskeys?

gotta have

1 ribeye steak (16-oz) - 1 tsp vegetable oil - 2 tbsp butter - 3 garlic cloves, roughly chopped - Salt and pepper to taste

let's cook

- 1. Take a cast iron skillet, place it in the oven, and preheat to 450° (You want the pan to be the temperature of the oven for an even cooking time and temperature.)
- 2. Brush both sides of the steak with oil and season with salt and pepper.
- 3. Once the oven has heated, remove the skillet and place it on the stovetop over medium heat.
- 4. Sear one side of the steak for two minutes. Flip the steak, top with garlic, and place in the oven for around six minutes. (This is where the oven comes in.)
- 5. Put steak back on stovetop over low heat. Flip the steak again and top with
- 6. Tilt the pan so you can scoop up the butter and garlic and continually coat for one to three minutes, depending on your desired doneness. Use a meat thermometer to confirm desired doneness: rare (125°), medium-rare (135°), medium (145°), medium-well (150°), and well-done (160°) please don't Remember, too, that the temperature will rise slightly during the next step, resting. Just because you've taken it out of the oven does not mean that the steak will stop cooking at that very





TRUSTEES ELECTION

The Trustees will hold an election on May 11, 2019 at the Good Will Fire Station from 8 am until 4 pm, to fill a vacancy on its Board. Should a run-off election be necessary, it will be held on June 22, 2019 from 8 AM until 4 PM at Goodwill Fire Station.

To vote in a Trustee election, you must be registered on the Trustees' voter list, which is an independent voter list, separate from City, State, or Federal registration. If you're not registered to vote, you may register at the Trustees' Office, 201 Delaware Street, during normal business hours, usually 10 am to 3 pm, Monday through Thursday. The deadline to register is May 6th. To qualify you must be at least 18 years of age and have been a resident of the City of New Castle for at least one year prior to the election date. Bring your driver's license showing your City of New Castle residence and other form of proof (MSC bill) to show that you meet these qualifications.

If you want to run for Trustee, the filing deadline is April 11. Candidates must be at least 25 years of age and must currently reside in the City of New Castle and have resided in the City for at lease two years prior to the election date. Forms are available at the Trustee office to file for candidacy.
