The New Castle Frenchtown Railroad

was one of the early railroads and was experimental in its construction. NC&FT rails were made of wood with strap iron nailed on top. Stone sleepers were placed under the rails but these did not extend from rail to rail as modern ties do. This set up proved to be inadequate because the rails tended to spread as the train moved over them. The road was opened in 1831. Due to the lack of an operable locomotive, horses were used to pull the carriages in the first year. When an English locomotive was acquired and put into use in 1832, its weight tended to buckle the strap iron on the rails causing the iron to pierce the carriages. In 1833 the wood rails and stone sleepers were replaced with iron rails and wood sleepers.

Besides the original tracks, NC&FT R.R. had a novel way of
stopping its trains. The book "A History of Travel in America"
gives this tale:

"On the New Castle and Frenchtown road... the prompt
halting of its first steam train was achieved in a manner still
more archaic... when the locomotive was approaching a point
to which a stop was necessary, the engineer then shut off the
power and sent a signal down the track by permitting steam to
escape from the safety valves, whereupon the negro
roustabouts would rush forward, seize hold of the engine with
their hands, lean backwards and dig their heels into the earth,
and the station agent would thrust a fence rail between the
spokes of the locomotive wheel. In this manner they could
bring the train to a pause within a few yards." Felix Cartagena

EASY one-pan DINNER

This dinner is easy enough to set up in the morning and then pop in the oven when you get home. Start by lining trays with parchment paper to speed cleanup later.

BBQ chicken, crispy broccoli and creamy fingerling potatoes come together in this simple, satisfying sheet-pan dinner.

Ingredients

4 skin-on chicken drumsticks (about 1 lb) • 3/4 lb (about 3 cups) fingerling potatoes, halved lengthwise • 3 tbsp extra-virgin olive oil • Kosher salt and freshly ground black pepper • 1 med head broccoli, cut into small florets (about 4 cups) • 2 tbsp purchased BBQ glaze

Directions

Make oven happy @ 450° and line a rimmed baking sheet with parchment paper. Place the drumsticks on one side of the baking sheet, spacing them evenly apart. Place the potatoes on the other side of the baking sheet, leaving an empty space in the center for the broccoli. Drizzle the potatoes with 1 tablespoon of of the olive oil, and sprinkle with salt and pepper, tossing to evenly coat. Bake until the potatoes begin to soften and the drumsticks begin to cook and caramelize, 20 minutes.

Remove the baking sheet from the oven and put the broccoli in the center. Drizzle the broccoli with the remaining 2 tbsp of olive oil, and lightly sprinkle with salt and pepper, tossing with tongs to evenly coat. Brush the drumsticks with the BBQ glaze on all sides. Return the baking sheet to the oven and roast until the broccoli and potatoes are tender and charred in spots and the drumsticks are completely cooked through and read an internal temperature of 160°, 20 to 25 minutes more. Divide chicken and vegetables between two plates and serve.

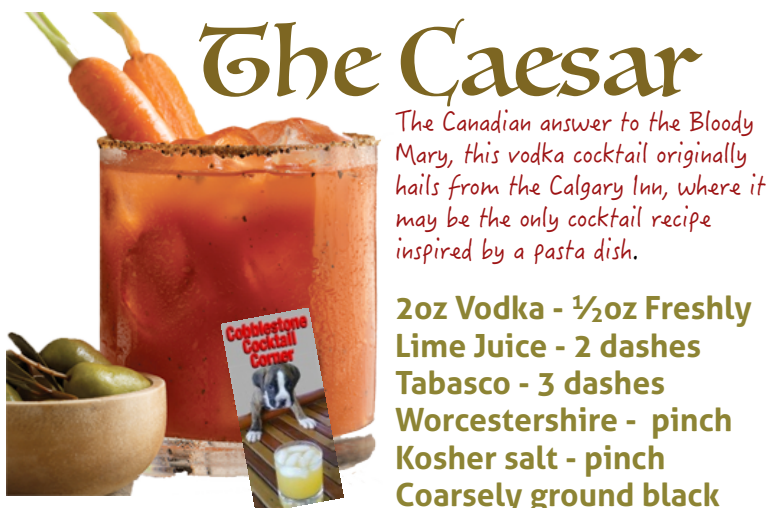

The Caesar

The Canadian answer to the Bloody Mary, this vodka cocktail originally hails from the Calgary Inn, where it may be the only cocktail recipe inspired by a pasta dish.

2oz Vodka - 1/2oz Freshly Lime Juice - 2 dashes Tabasco - 3 dashes Worcestershire - pinch Kosher salt - pinch Coarsely ground black

pepper - 3oz Tomato juice- 2oz Clam juice

Add all of the ingredients in a mixing glass, add ice, and roll the contents between mixing glass and a shaker tin until well-blended.

Rim the lip of a double Old Fashioned glass with lime, and dip it into a mixture of the pepper and salt.

Strain into a prepared ice-filled double Old Fashioned glass, and garnish with a carrot sliced lengthwise.

Vincent van Gogh (birthday this Friday) sold just one painting, The Red Vineyard, during his lifetime. He became famous only after his death.

Van Gogh was 27 years old when he painted his first piece. Before that, he was failing as an art dealer and engaging in missionary work. Mostly self-taught, he died in 1890 under mysterious circumstances. 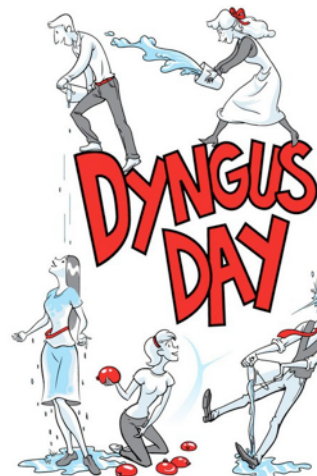

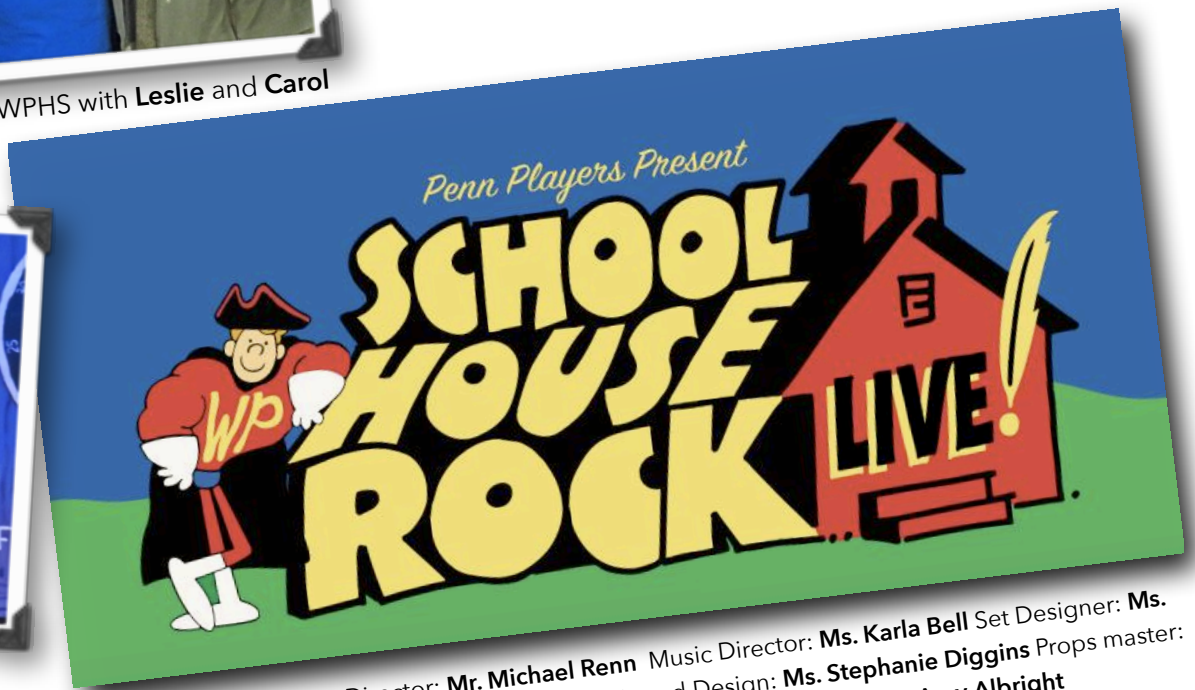
