a tradition ends

Delaware firefighters decide to end an over 90-year parade tradition. At their quarterly Delaware Volunteer Firefighter's Association meeting last week, members voted to eliminate the parade that began shortly after the organization was formed in 1921. Cost concerns (\$20,000) along with dwindling attendance were key factors in making that hard decision.

Warren Jones (*DVFA Executive Manager*), said 30 to 40 companies typically participated in the event, the bulk of the parade lineup came from Kent County.

He described the waning public interest as "a sign of the times" and said fewer firefighters took part because of other commitments and an overall drop in volunteers statewide.

"I'm sure there's some sadness involved with the tradition ending," Jones said.

"Parades used to be quite popular but all our members today are extremely busy with fire and EMS calls and just don't have as much spare time to devote."





the crust

- 300g Oreo cookies
- ½ cup butter

the cheesecake filling

- 8 oz cream cheese
- 1 cup powdered sugar
- 1 cup heavy cream,

directions

- Chop and crush oreos to a fine crumb and add melted butter, and mix to combine. Pat this mixture firmly into the bottom of a 9" springform cake pan. Freeze for 10 minutes.
- Whip the cream cheese with the powdered sugar until smooth, then fold in whipped cream. Spoon this evenly into the frozen crust and refrigerate until set, about 3 hours or preferably overnight.
- Heat the remaining cream to a simmer and pour over dark chocolate to melt. Stir until completely smooth.
- Pour the ganache filling over the set cream cheese filling and top with sliced strawberries. Finally, drizzle with nutella and serve.






DNREC and the Delaware State Parks has launched **Play Outside**, a new website for Delaware residents and visitors that provides convenient and detailed information about


