



#### gather up all this

6 oz garlic-flavored croutons 1/2 tsp ground black pepper 1/2 tsp cayenne pepper 1 tsp chili powder 1 tsp dried thyme 1/2 onion, roughly chopped

1 carrot, peeled and broken 3 whole cloves garlic 1/2 red bell pepper 18 oz ground chuck 18 oz ground sirloin 1 1/2 tsp kosher salt 1 egg

#### Heat that oven to 325°

In a food processor bowl, combine croutons, black pepper, cayenne pepper, chili powder, and thyme. Pulse until the mixture is of a fine texture. Place this

mixture into a large bowl. Combine the onion, carrot, garlic, and red pepper in the food

processor bowl. Pulse until the mixture is finely chopped, but not pureed. Combine the

vegetable mixture, ground sirloin, and ground chuck with the bread crumb mixture. Season the meat mixture with the kosher salt. Add the egg and combine thoroughly, but avoid squeezing the meat.

Pack this mixture into a 10-inch loaf pan to mold the shape of the meatloaf. Onto a parchment paper-lined baking sheet, turn the meatloaf out of the pan onto the center of the tray. Insert a temperature probe at a 45 degree angle into the top of the meatloaf. Avoid touching the bottom of the tray with the probe. Set the probe for 155°.

Combine the catsup, cumin, Worcestershire sauce, hot pepper sauce and honey. Brush the glaze onto the meatloaf after it has been cooking for about 10 minutes.





### "Today was a long time coming,"





The Court House, Sheriff's House, Dover Green and Woodlawn Properties are part of the National Monument. The sheriff's House and the Woodlawn properties are the only sites the National Park Service actually own. The State continues to own and operate the Court House, Green, Arsenal and Academy building. The National Park Service has historic easements on the properties, which means we cannot change, sell or alter the properties without consultation with the park service. The point of this is to protect the properties.
