for the crust

cooking spray - 12 chocolate oreo cookies, crushed - 2
tbsp. melted butter - pinch of kosher salt

for the cheesecake

12 oz. cream cheese, softened - 2 large eggs 1/3 c. granulated
sugar - 1/4 c. Baileys Original Irish Cream - 1/4 c. sour cream
1 1/2 tbsp. all-purpose flour, divided - 1/2 tsp. pure vanilla
extract pinch of kosher salt - 1/2 c. mini chocolate chips

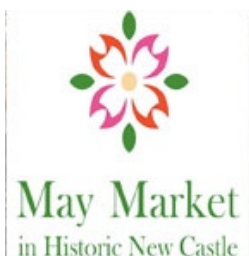
Make oven happy at 325° and line a 12-cup muffin tin with paper liners. Spray liners with cooking spray. In a large bowl, combine crushed cookies, melted butter, and a pinch of salt and stir until completely combined. Press cookie mixture into paper liners and set aside.

In a large bowl, beat cream cheese until light and fluffy, then add eggs and sugar and beat until smooth. Add Baileys, sour cream, 1 tbsp flour, vanilla, and a pinch of salt and beat until combined.

In a medium bowl, toss mini chocolate chips with remaining 1/2 tbsp flour, then fold into cheesecake batter and spoon over cookie crusts.

Bake until centers are almost set, about 20 minutes. They may jiggle slightly in the center. Let cool for 30 minutes at room temperature, then refrigerate until set, about 2 hours.

Remove cheesecakes from muffin pan and discard paper liners. Top with whipped cream, drizzle with chocolate sauce, and sprinkle with mini chocolate chips. SEE THE VIDEO

TRUSTEES ELECTION

The Trustees will hold an election on **May 11, 2019** at the Good Will Fire Station from 8 am until 4 pm, to fill a vacancy on its Board. Should a run-off election be necessary, it will be held on June 22, 2019 from 8 AM until 4 PM at Goodwill Fire Station.

To vote in a Trustee election, you must be registered on the Trustees' voter list, which is an independent voter list, separate from City, State, or Federal registration. If you're not registered to vote, you may register at the Trustees' Office, 201 Delaware Street, during normal business hours, usually 10 am to 3 pm, Monday through Thursday. The deadline to register is May 6th. To qualify you must be at least 18 years of age and have been a resident of the City of New Castle for at least one year prior to the election date. Bring your driver's license showing your City of New Castle residence and other form of proof (MSC bill) to show that you meet these qualifications.

If you want to run for Trustee, the filing deadline is April 11. Candidates must be at least 25 years of age and must currently reside in the City of New Castle and have resided in the City for at least two years prior to the election date. Forms are available at the Trustee office to file for candidacy.

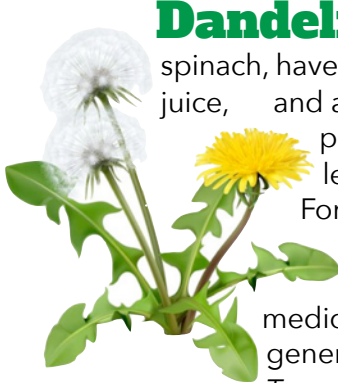
Dandelions are more nutritious than spinach, have 25 times the vitamin A of tomato juice, and are a good source of calcium, potassium, magnesium, iron, lecithin, and vitamins C, B, and E. For many early settlers, dandelions made a life-saving spring tonic. The dandelion was a standard medicinal plant used by herbalists for generations. Their Latin name—

Taraxacum officinale—means a remedy for disorders. The leaves are a powerful diuretic but since they do not flush potassium from the body they are actually safer than pharmaceutical diuretics. The roots are slightly laxative and a tea made from ground fresh or dried roots is reported to improve digestion.

Similar to their cousin chicory, the roots can be roasted until they are dark brown inside and out, ground into a powder, and used as a coffee substitute.

Recipes When life gives us lemons we are told to make lemonade but what should we do with too many dandelions? Make [dandelion wine](#), of course, or [dandelion jelly](#)! Both will be sweet reminders of spring to enjoy next winter.

Since dandelions are closely related to those bitter epicurean greens endive, chicory, escarole, and radicchio, you could harvest the free, rampant growing dandelion greens and put them to good use.

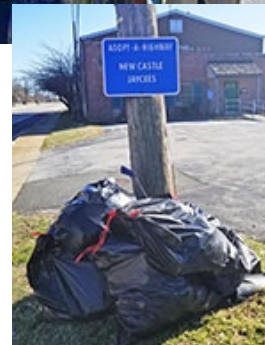
New Castle Jaycees keep entrance to our historic town clean and inviting!

Archaeology Work to Begin Around Sheriff's House

First State National Historical Park, in partnership with the Del. Div. of Historical and Cultural Affairs, is initiating an archaeological investigation prior to the final planning for the rehabilitation.

Ahead of this rehabilitation work, an archaeological investigation will be undertaken to identify buried cultural resources within the project area, such as the remains of buildings or concentrations of artifacts.

The archaeological survey will be conducted by professional archaeologists from EAC/Archaeology, with over site from the National Park Service and the State of Delaware. Archaeological testing will begin within the next two to six weeks, and last approximately one to two weeks. The public is welcome to stop by and see what evidence of the past is being uncovered.
