BUILD A WALL AROUND THE CITY'S HISTORIC AREA

It's nothing new, and the issue has been raised several times in the past 40 years. The initial concept, however, originated in January 1974 by the venerable Carlisle H. Humelsine, then long-time president of Colonial Williamsburg. He contended the closure of additional streets – in addition to Duke of Gloucester Street – to cars, and restriction of people from entering the historic area, would capture important lost revenue. In turn, the visitors' free access experience would be eliminated.

Easter Deviled Eggs



A very easy, special touch for Easter and fun to do at baby showers as well. Do some plain white ones to keep everyone happy.

12 large eggs • 1/4 cup mayo • salt and ground black pepper to taste • hot sauce • 1/4 tsp dry mustard • see coloring below

DIRECTIONS

Place eggs into a large saucepan, cover with cold water, and bring to a boil. Let eggs boil for 3 minutes; turn off heat, cover pot, and let eggs cook in hot water for at least 20 minutes. Drain and cover eggs with cold water. Peel cooled eggs.

Or cheat like I do and buy pre cooked eggs at ShopRite

► Cut hard-cooked eggs in half lengthwise and remove yolks; mash yolks in a bowl with mayo, salt, black pepper, hot sauce, and dry mustard until smooth.

► For the colors, I used McCormick® Assorted Food Colors & Egg Dye and saw they had recipes for pastel colors, I tweaked them a little because they are for dyeing eggs with the shell on:

Dusty Rose: 7 drops of red + 3 drops of blue - Orange: 4 to 5 drops of yellow + 1 drop of red - Purple: 6 drops of red + 7 drops of blue - Mint Green: 7 drops of green + 3 drops of yellow

► Drop the food color into clear glasses and then add water. Add the egg white halves. The longer you let the eggs sit in the food color, the darker the colors will be.. Drain colored egg whites on paper towels.

► Pipe or spoon egg yolk filling into colored egg white halves; cover and chill before serving, at least 30 minutes

speckled egg MIMOSAS

To make 4-6 mimosas you'll need

1/2 c. Sugar - 2 c. water
8 blackberries - 1 bottle of champagne - 1 bag of speckled egg candies
1 handful of edible flowers for garnish.

Here's how...

Blackberry simple syrup. Bring the water to a boil and add sugar. As soon as the sugar has begun to dissolve, add the black berries and muddle to break them up and release the color. The ratio of water to sugar in this syrup is pretty diluted. The fruit

adds extra sweetness and champagne is already a little sweet on it's own, so it really doesn't need much. Allow to simmer for 3-5 minutes then remove from heat.

- ◆ Once cool, drain the syrup into a glass pitcher through a strainer.
- ◆ To assemble the mimosas, place three speckled eggs in the bottom of each glass. Top each glass with about 2 ounces (or one New Castle shot) of blackberry simple syrup. Fill the remaining portion of the glass with champagne and then top with edible flowers!
