Close to a hundred interested citizens came to the Arasapha Garden Club sponsored Candidates Forum last Wednesday evening. Nancy Coning posed the submitted questions while Dorsey Fisk acted as timekeeper. Seated in front of the stage were the three mayoralty candidates: Reese, Padmalingam and Hickman. Ratchford and Megginson each vying for Council President. Two seats on City

Council are sought by incumbents Vannucci and Cochran. SURRENDER

In conjunction with a major event at **Appomattox Court House National Historical Park**, the National Park Service and its partners invite communities across the nation to join in this commemoration. **The bells will ring first at Appomattox at 3pm on April 9th.** The ringing will coincide with the moment the historic meeting between Grant and Lee in the McLean House at Appomattox Court House ended. While Lee's surrender did not end the Civil War, the act is seen by most Americans as the symbolic end of four years of bloodshed.

*After the ringing at Appomattox, bells will reverberate across the country. The First State National Historical Park, in collaboration with the Delaware Division of Historical and Cultural Affairs, First State Heritage Park, Lewes Historical Society, and the Old Swedes Foundation, is orchestrating bell-ringing at sites across Delaware. Houses of worship, schools, city halls, public buildings, historic sites, and others are invited to join in the commemoration by ringing their bells at **precisely 3:15 p.m. on Thurs., April 9th.** Bells should continue ringing for four minutes (each minute symbolic of a year of war).*





PIZZA MEATLOAF CUPS




START WITH THIS

- 1 egg, beaten
- 1/2 cup pizza sauce
- 1/4 cup seasoned bread crumbs
- 1/2 teaspoon Italian seasoning
- 1 1/2 lbs ground beef
- 1 1/2 cups shredded part-skim mozzarella cheese
- additional pizza sauce

MAKE LIKE THIS



- In a bowl, combine the egg, pizza sauce, bread crumbs and Italian seasoning.
- Fold beef into mixture and mix well.
- Divide meat mixture into 12 greased muffin cups.
- Press mixture into bottom and up the sides.
- Fill center with cheese.
- Bake at 375°F for 15-18 minutes or until meat is no longer pink.
- Serve immediately with additional pizza sauce and cheese if desired.
- Or cool, place in freezer bags and freeze for up to 3 months. To use frozen pizza cups. Thaw in the refrigerator for 24 hours.
- Heat in microwave on high for 2-3 minutes or until heated through.
- Top with additional pizza sauce and cheese if desired.




BROWN DERBY

(1) Property and Casualty Insurance; (2) Public Officials Liability and Police Liability Insurance from July 1, 2015-June 30, 2016.





Apotheosis of the Family



Recently a reader asked whatever happened to 'that mural' that was in the WSFS lobby on Market Street. Well, 'that mural' is N.C. Wyeth's Apotheosis of the Family. The 19-by-60 foot stately work of art had adorned the two-story lobby since 1932. In 1929, former WSFS Bank President, Frederick E. Stone, commissioned Delaware Valley painter and illustrator, N.C. Wyeth to create a mural for the south wall lobby. The completed masterpiece, was unveiled in 1932.

The mural presently is with Ely Company, which is providing museum quality, climate-controlled storage for the artwork. The Delaware Historical Society is working on plans to conserve and possibly exhibit the mural at a yet-to-be-determined date. DHS's Scott Loehr tells Cobblestones that after a future capital campaign the mural may be ready for public display. A three-to-five-year time frame is somewhat realistic. In the scheme of fine art for future generations it's a short wait. – Teditor



Happy Thomas Jefferson Birthday *Thomas Jefferson was a very remarkable man who started learning very early in life and never stopped.*

at **5**, began studying under his cousin's tutor. **9**, studied Lin, Greek and French. **14**, studied classical literature and additional languages. **16**, entered the College of William and Mary. Also could write in Greek with one hand while writing the same in Lin with the other. **19**, studied Law for 5 years starting under George Wythe. **23**, started his own law practice. **25**, was elected to the Virginia House of Burgesses. **31**, wrote the widely circulated "Summary View of the Rights of British America" And retired from his law practice. **33**, was a delegate to the Second Continental Congress. **33**, wrote the Declaration of Independence. **33**, took three years to revise Virginia's legal code and wrote a Public Education bill and a statute for Religious Freedom. **36**, was elected the second Governor of Virginia succeeding Prick Henry. **40**, served in Congress for two years. **41**, was the American minister to France and negotiated commercial treaties with European nations along with Ben Franklin and John Adams. **46**, served as the first Secretary of State under George Washington. **53**, served as Vice President and was elected president of the American Philosophical Society. **55**, drafted the Kentucky Resolutions and became the active head of Republican Party. **57**, was elected the third president of the United States. **60**, obtained the Louisiana Purchase doubling the nation's size. **61**, was elected to a second term as President. **65**, retired to Monticello. **80**, helped President Monroe shape the Monroe Doctrine. **81**, almost single-handedly creed the University of Virginia and served as its first president. **83**, died on the 50th anniversary of the Signing of the Declaration of Independence along with John Adams.

President Kennedy held a dinner in the White House for a group of the brightest minds in the nation at that time. He made this statement: "This is perhaps the assembly of the most intelligence ever to gather at one time in the White House with the exception of when Thomas Jefferson dined alone."
