## COMMUNITY LENTEN SERIES

Each year, the churches of the New Castle community take turns hosting a simple supper and brief service on each of the Wednesdays in Lent, from 6:00-7:30 p.m. Each year, we follow a theme throughout the Lenten Season. This year, we'll be focusing on encounters with Jesus, by people whose lives were changed in different ways.

April 10<sup>th</sup> - New Castle United Methodist Church Nicodemus, John 3:1-21

On Saturday, May 18th, up to 25 plein air artists are invited to come to the town's annual **Day In Old New Castle**.

The historic waterfront town opens select historic houses and gardens to ticketed visitors to tour all day for one price. Though not affiliated with DONC, Mo'zArt Gallery will host painters who are invited to paint their chosen subjects including historic buildings, street scenes and even the beautiful tall ship, the AJ Meerwald, visiting that day. Painters check in at Mo'zArt Gallery between 8 and 9 am and begin painting in town. At 1 pm artists will display ONE painting on its easel along the Historic Green where visitors can admire and place their votes for Peoples' Choice Award. Sales are optional and conducted directly between buyer and artist who keeps 100% of the sale. Payments can be by cash, check, or credit card if the artist has the tool to process cards.

Mo'zArt Gallery processes no sales. The display ends by 3:30 and unsold art and easels must be removed.

This event is to mutually promote the beauty of New Castle and to display created art to visitors and residents of the town. **25 artist's applications are accepted on a non-juried first come, first served basis.** There is a registration fee of \$15 not payable until the applying artist is notified of acceptance. At that time, the artist will be directed to send the fee to Dennis Young in the Gallery. The fee is to support awards to artists. Additional awards may be added (more information to come about this.) Opening date for application is April 8th and the process will close with the 25th applicant. There will be a waiting list also.



# When it comes to weeknight dinners, this is what we dream of. It's simple, creamy, and so dang satisfying.

### All you need is...

1/2 c. all-purpose flour, 3/4 c freshly grated Parmesan, divided 1 tsp. garlic powder, Zest of 1/2 lemon, kosher salt & freshly ground black pepper, 3 boneless skinless chicken breasts, 2 tbsp. extra-virgin olive oil, 1 tbsp. butter, 2 cloves garlic, minced, 2 c. baby spinach, 1 c. heavy cream, 2/3 c. low-sodium chicken broth, 1 lemon, sliced in rounds and halved, 1/4 c. thinly sliced fresh basil

## Easy fixn'too!

On a large plate, combine flour with 1/4 cup Parmesan, garlic powder, and lemon zest. Season generously with salt and pepper and mix thoroughly with a fork. Dredge each chicken breast on all sides with flour mixture. Set aside.

In a large skillet over medium-high heat, heat oil until shimmering but not smoking. Add chicken and sear until golden, 6 minutes. Flip and cook until opposite side is golden, around 6 minutes more. Remove from pan and set aside.

Turn heat down to medium and add butter to pan. When butter is melted add garlic and cook until fragrant, about 1 minute. Add spinach and cook until wilted, 1 to 2 minutes. Add chicken broth, cream, and remaining 1/2 cup Parmesan and season with more salt and pepper. Stir to combine. Add lemon slices, bring to a simmer and cook until thickened slightly, 3 to 4 minutes. Return chicken to skillet and simmer until chicken is cooked through, 5 to 6 minutes more.

When chicken is cooked, remove skillet from heat and garnish with basil before serving.



## Spiced Pear Bourbon Old Fashioned

1 Cup of Bourbon, 1 Pear, Peeled and Diced, 1 Cinnamon Stick, 1/8 Tsp. Nutmeg, 2 Whole Cloves, 1 Tbsp. Brown Sugar, Orange Peel and a Splash of Water. **Now make some** 

In a mason jar, combine bourbon, diced pear, cinnamon stick,

nutmeg, cloves, and brown sugar. Shake well and let marinate overnight in the refrigerator. When ready to serve the cocktail, place two large ice cubes into a glass. Strain the bourbon through a fine mesh strainer.

Twist an orange peel over the glass and rub around the rim. Pour the strained spiced pear bourbon into the glass and stir twice. (However much you fancy here.)

Serve immediately and garnish with extra pear, a sprinkle of cinnamon, and an orange peel.
