Download the data. 1 lb. shrimp (about 20 pieces), peeled and deveined, with tails still on - 7 pieces of thick cut bacon, cut into thirds - 4 tbsp. butter, melted 2 tbsp. maple syrup - 1 tbsp. chili powder

- Brush with remaining butter and broil 3minutes.


