Then you'll make your request and await Facebook's compiling of your data, which is delivered via an email link. If you've been on Facebook for many years, expect the link to take a while.

Once the file arrives, double-click to open the "index.htm" file in an Internet browser, and look it over.

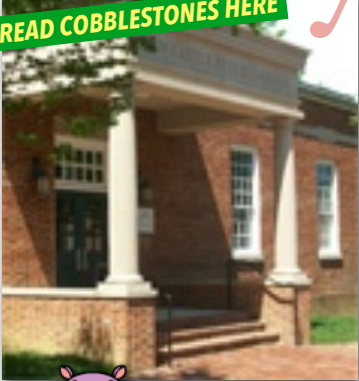

BACON wrapped



All ya need is...

1 lb. shrimp (about 20 pieces), peeled and deveined, with tails still on - 7 pieces of thick cut bacon, cut into thirds - 4 tbsp. butter, melted
2 tbsp. maple syrup - 1 tbsp. chili powder


The fun part...

- Make oven happy @ 400°. Line a large baking sheet with aluminum foil. Wrap shrimp with one third piece of bacon and secure with a toothpick. Place shrimp on prepared pan.
- In a small bowl mix together butter, maple syrup, and chili powder.
- Brush shrimp with about half of the butter.
- Bake for 15 minutes or until bacon is crisp and shrimp is cooked.
- Brush with remaining butter and broil 3 minutes.

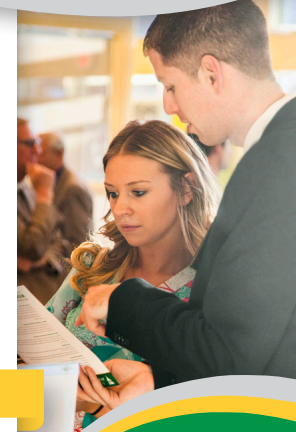

Consider these bright and colorful flowers for your garden this year. These perennials are daisy-like with raised centers, and it's the seeds found in the dried flower heads that attract birds as well as butterflies.

They tend to bloom midsummer, are relatively drought-tolerant, and can take the heat!

Coneflowers also make great cut flowers!

European explorers encountered coneflowers in the Southeastern United States. Echinacea plants first appear in botanical history in 1699, when a British naturalist sent samples to England. Purple coneflower (*Echinacea purpurea*) is probably the most commonly known species.

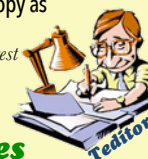

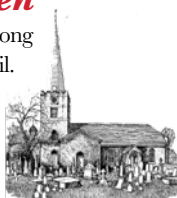
