is please to announce that we have officially placed into service Engine 18-2.

Engine 18-2 is a 2016 Pierce Arrow XT pumper. The unit features a 1500GPM pump, 750 gallon water tank, and multiple hand lines. the new Engine 18 was backed into the station on March 10th. Members have been undergoing familiarization training and reviewing equipment layouts and hose packs.

The original Rescue 18 served New Castle for twenty years and has been officially sold to the Pitcarn Fire Company of Pennsylvania.

Rescue 18 was purchased in 1994 and delivered in July of 1995. The Rescue was equipped with state of the Art Holmatro rescue tools, rope rescue and water rescue equipment, along with all of the necessary equipment to be classified as a pumper and conduct fire fighting duties. To replace Rescue 18, Engine 18-3 has been undergoing a conversion in the last two months and will soon be redesigned as Engine 18-6 and will carry our vehicle rescue equipment much like Rescue 18 did.


- 14 tsp. crushed red pepper flakes * Freshly ground black pepper
- 1 c. vegetable stock * 1 c. freshly grated Parmesan
- ½ c. crumbled feta * 1 c. chopped fresh basil

directions

- 1. Bring an 8-quart stock pot of water to a boil and generously season with salt. Cook pasta according to package directions, until al dente. Drain, reserving 1 cup pasta water.
- 2. Return pot to stove over medium-high heat. Add olive oil to pot and place lemons cut side down on the bottom of the pot. Sear lemons until they have a golden brown color, about 3 minutes, then remove and set aside. Add butter, garlic, and red pepper flakes to pot; cook until garlic has softened, about 2 to 3 minutes. Add 1 tablespoon lemon zest, juice of 2 lemons, 1 teaspoon salt, 1/2 teaspoon black pepper, and vegetable stock and stir.
- 3. Add pasta to pot with garlic-lemon mixture. Mix in half the parmesan and feta. (If pasta seems dry, slowly add reserved pasta water until desired consistency.) Just before serving, mix in half the chopped basil.
- 4. Transfer pasta to a platter and top with remaining parmesan, feta, and basil. Serve immediately & ENJOY!
