planning notes

- As soon as possible all areas should be mowed so new green shoots of invasive weeds are visible (botanically they show growth earlier than natives)
 - Eradicate weeds by spraying glyphosate based aquatic approved herbicide
 - Wait till new green shoots re-appear
 - Eradicate weeds by spraying glyphosate based aquatic approved herbicide
 - Plant temporary annuals and cover crop as per design provided by ForeSite
 - Eradicate all plant material to prepare area for meadow seeding (mow and wait for growth flush if necessary)
 - Install meadow plants as per design provided by ForeSite
- This calendar is intended as a preliminary planning guide only and variations will occur depending on weather conditions. Based on last years test meadow it is expected that the Bull Hill area will most likely remain wetter longer than the other locations and may be slightly behind the proposed schedule.*




INVITATION TO BID

14th STREET AREA ROADWAY AND DRAINAGE IMPROVEMENTS

Sealed bids for the City of New Castle 14th Street Area Roadway and Drainage Improvements Project will be received by the City Administrator until 10:00 a.m. on Friday, May 8, 2015, at the City Administration Building, 220 Delaware Street, New Castle, at which time they will be publicly opened and read. Bids received after the stated time will be returned unopened.

Project includes a base bid and three alternate bids. Base bid work involves the complete rebuild of portions of 14th Street, Bellanca Street, and Linden Avenue and mill and overlay portion of Bellanca Street in the Route 273 right-of-way. Substantial demolition and the addition of drainage inlets and pipes are included. Project also includes maintenance of traffic, curb and gutter, driveway restoration, site restoration, and striping and signage. One alternate bid involves a turning lane from a State roadway and portion of entrance for new parking area, demolition of existing shoulder, grading for drainage, maintenance of traffic, and striping and signage. Other alternates involve complete rebuild and / or mill and overlay of two alleys and include maintenance of traffic, sidewalk, valley gutter, crosswalk, and handicap ramps.

Bidding documents may be obtained during normal business hours from New Castle Public Services Department, 900 Wilmington Road (Trolley Barn), New Castle. A Pre-Bid Meeting will be held on Friday, April 24, 2015 at 10:00 a.m. at Town Hall, 201 Delaware Street, New Castle. Attendance of this meeting is mandatory for all prospective bidders and will be a pre-requisite for submitting a bid. Bids shall be submitted in a sealed envelope and shall be marked clearly as follows: Sealed Bid - Proposal for 14th Street Area Roadway and Drainage Improvements Project. Requirements for a 10% Bid Bond, 100% Performance Bond, 100% Payment Bond and Maintenance Bond, and Contractor's Insurance are included in the Contract Documents.

Minority Business Enterprises (MBE), Disadvantaged Business Enterprises (DBE) and Women-Owned Business Enterprises (WBE) will be afforded full opportunity to submit bids on this contract and are encouraged to do so.

Each Bidder must deposit with their bid a security equivalent to 10% of the bid amount, form and subject to the conditions provided in the instructions for bidders. The City of New Castle reserves the right to reject any or all bids and makes such award as appears most advantageous to the City.

The City may extend the time and place for the opening of the bids from that described in the advertisement, with not less than two calendar days-notice by certified delivery, facsimile machine, e-mail, or other electronic means to those bidders who have obtained bid packets.



NOTICE TO BID

The City of New Castle is seeking sealed bids, and qualification statements, from firms/providers interested in providing any one coverage or combination of coverages for the following municipal insurance options:

(1) Property and Casualty Insurance; (2) Public Officials Liability and Police Liability Insurance from July 1, 2015-June 30, 2016.

Interested respondents must submit their bids, along with their qualification statements, by 9 a.m. on Friday, May 1st, 2015, at the New Castle City Administration office, 220 Delaware Street, New Castle, DE 19720.

Documentation submitted must include a statement concerning the degree to which assistance shall be provided by the respondent to the City in completing all documentation required by carriers for applications.

Submittals must also include the names of proposed carriers from which quotes are intended to be sought. The City reserves the right to approve and assign carriers to the various respondents by providing broker of record letters.

Submittals provided after the deadline will not be considered.

The intended result of this process is for the City to select one or more providers whose primary task will be to secure insurance premium quotes from insurance carriers for the lines of insurance listed above.
