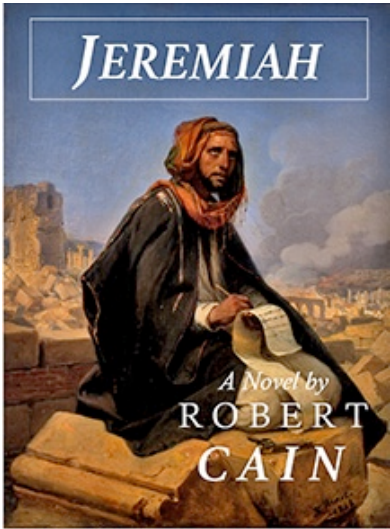

Newcastillian pens historical novel



The historical novel, JEREMIAH, is based on the biblical narratives principally found in the Book of Jeremiah, 2 Kings and 2 Chronicles. Though religious in background, it can be appreciated by secular readers, as the story is a human adventure of discovery entailing love, conflict and war, death and ultimate triumph.

A sixteen-year-old Jeremiah lives in the small community of Anathoth. He, like the people of sixth-century BCE Judah, enjoys a complacent life of peace and relative comfort. However, the Lord God is angry with the people because of their worshipping foreign gods and indulging in selfish behavior. Jeremiah is called upon by God to be his prophet and change the course of events, but peace quickly becomes war, contentment is soon transformed into chaos. With the destruction of

Jerusalem and Solomon's Temple by the Babylonians, Jeremiah and Judah are inextricably bound in a secular and spiritual conflict which is ripping their world apart setting them upon a soul-searching journey in finding peace and ultimately, happiness. Death, however, may be their only refuge.



PICKLED Red Onions



Spicy Pickled Red Onions are quick, easy, and the perfect accompaniment to sandwiches and salads, or tacos and burrito bowls!

GONNA Need

- 2 large red onions, cut into rings - 1½ cups of water
- 3 cups of white vinegar - 1 cup of granulated sugar
- 6 cloves of garlic, peeled and cut into rounds
- 2-3 jalapeño peppers, seeded, and cut in half or rounds - cilantro sprigs

FIXN'

1. Add water, vinegar and sugar to a sauce pot. Cook over medium heat until sugar is dissolved.
2. Remove from heat and set aside.
3. Peel garlic, chop into rounds and add to vinegar mixture.
4. Cut onions into rounds; cut and seed jalapeño peppers as well.
5. Add red onions, jalapeños, and cilantro sprigs to storage jars.
6. Pour vinegar mixture into jars.
7. Keep at room temperature until cooled; then store in your refrigerator in an airtight container.

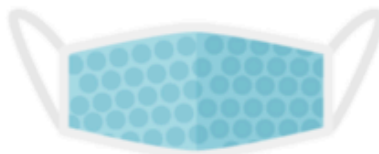
