DNREC initially published outdated original dock concept

NOT a pier.

All the posted City Council agenda had to say was, "Pier Update"

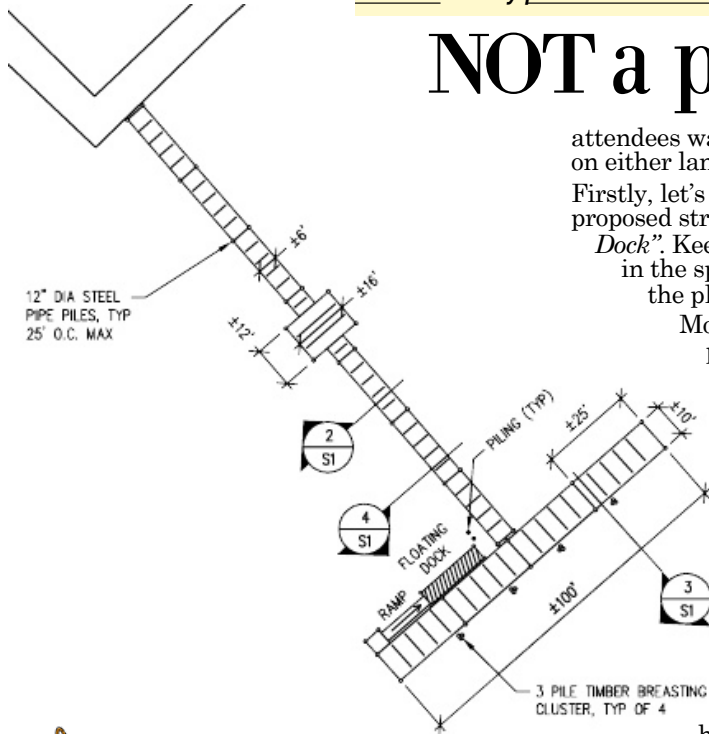
and that guaranteed a large turnout Tuesday evening. Not all attendees wanted to feast on the latest discussion on what's *not* in the river; some were on either lane of the truck traffic on Washington Street issue.

Firstly, let's get our feet wet. Council President Linda Ratchford made it clear that the proposed structure in not a pier. "It's a dock" she said. Later she called it the "Citizens Dock". Keep in mind, it's not a marina either although there is some "marina speak" in the specs that DNREC has. There are NO day slips. Good Will doesn't think it's the place for its rescue craft.

Most importantly, it was made clear Tuesday evening that this was a permitting process and not a vote on allocating anything...monies included. Council made it clear that not one dollar has been budgeted though a \$785,000 estimate has been made. Councilperson Megginson reminded everyone that at the Meet The Candidates night prior to the last years election, "that everyone one sitting at this table pledged that no City money would be spent on this thing". He went on to say this talk going around was "just crap", urging citizens to "call us" to quell rumors.

Changing lanes now, the City Police have been issuing warnings (60-70) to truck traffic during March on Rt. 9 in the Dobbinsville corridor to Washington Street. Starting this week, they are enforcing the *local delivery only* signs restricting truck traffic on Washington Street with tickets. Trucking business owners objected to adding miles to their routes from detouring to Federal School Lane or Hamburg Road. Residents objected to damage to their homes and the noise of the tractor trailers all hours of the day and night. This topic surely will continue as DelDOT continues it's quest/adventure on Washington Street and Rt. 9. — *teditor*

Challenge/Reply Rule

Here's the basic rules for expanded replay review for the regular season that allow managers to challenge calls:

- 1 Each manager gets one challenge to use in the first six innings. If a manager successfully challenges a call in the first six innings, he will get another challenge to use in the first six innings. No third challenge will be issued.
- 2 Umpires will decide when calls need to be reviewed in the seventh inning and thereafter.
- 3 The new system allows for the reviews of homers, ground-rule doubles, fan interference, boundary calls, most force plays, tag plays, fair or foul calls in the outfield, outfielders trapping the ball, hit by pitches, timing plays (whether a runner scores before a third out), touching a base, passing runners and record keeping, according to the New York Daily News.
- 4 Balls hopping over 1st or 3rd base that require a fair-or-foul ruling can't be challenged.
- 5 A member of each team's video staff can communicate his opinion of a call to his team's dugout. Each team will have access to the same video feeds for review in any given ballpark. There will be a phone connecting the video room and dugout.

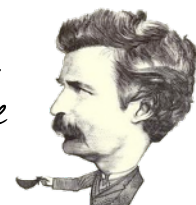

Excellent 'Ain't Misbehavin' gets

When "Ain't Misbehavin'" opened, it barnstormed its way into the theatrical canon and onto Broadway platforms all over New York. An unexpected hit in 1978, the iconic show continues to barnstorm its way into the hearts of audiences, as this latest production at the Delaware Theatre Company so stylishly illustrates.

"Ain't Misbehavin'" was created by Richard Maltby Jr. and Murray Kordofsky, who wove together the remarkable

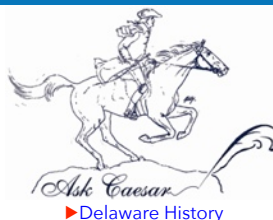
