Votes are unofficial at press time. There was one write-in vote for City Council and 19 write-ins for City Clerk.

*Commencing with the election to be held in calendar year 2013, the terms for City offices shall be staggered; the Mayor and two Council members shall be elected for a two-year term, while the President of Council, the remaining two Council members, and the Treasurer and the City Clerk shall be elected to four-year terms. The four Council member candidates receiving the highest number of votes shall be elected to four-year term seats on Council. The two receiving the two next highest number of votes shall be elected to four-year term seats on Council. The reafter, in all odd numbered years, two Council members and either the Mayor or the President of Council, depending on whose term has expired, shall be elected for four-year terms.

1 package regular Oreo cookies (Not Double Stuff) - about 36 cookies

6 Tablespoon butter, melted 1-8 ounce package cream cheese, softened

1/4 cup granulated sugar 2 Tablespoons cold milk

1- 12 ounce tub Cool Whip, divided

2 – 3.9 ounce packages Chocolate Instant Pudding.

3 1/4 cups cold milk

1 and 1/2 cups mini chocolate chips

Begin by crushing 36 Oreo cookies. No cheating, crush them all! You can use a food processor for this, but you could also place them in a large ziplock bag and crush them with a rolling pin. When the Oreos have turned into fine crumbs, you are done.

2 Transfer the Oreo crumbs to a large bowl. Stir in 6 tablespoons melted butter and use a fork to incorporate the butter into the cookie crumbs. When the butter is distributed, transfer the mixture to a 9 x 13 inch baking dish. Press the crumbs into the bottom of the pan. Place the pan in the refrigerator while you work on the additional layers.

 $oldsymbol{6}$ Mix the cream cheese with a mixer until light and fluffy. Add in 2 Tablespoons of milk, and sugar, and mix well. Stir in 1 and 1/4 cups Cool Whip. Spread this mixture over the crust.

4 In a bowl, combine chocolate instant pudding with 3 and 1/4 cups cold milk. Whisk for several minutes until the pudding starts to thicken. Use a spatula to spread the mixture over the previous cream cheese layer. Allow the dessert to rest for about 5 minutes so that the pudding can firm up further.

5 Spread the remaining Cool Whip over the top. Sprinkle mini chocolate chips evenly over the top. Place in the freezer for 1 hour, or the refrigerator for 4 hours before serving.
