

17 John Campbell published what would eventually become the first successful American newspaper. It was known as the Boston "News-Letter." 1704, **General Grant** banned the trading of prisoners. 1864, The game "snooker" was invented by Sir Neville Chamberlain. 1874, **The FBI lab** reported that it could not determine the lyrics to **Louie Louie**. 1964 The Postal Service unveiled its new 22-cent "LOVE" stamp, using the set of "The Love Boat" as a backdrop. It became one of the most popular ever offered. 1985

18 Paul Revere makes his famous ride from Charlestown to Lexington, shouting "the Red Coats are coming" as the Revolutionary War begins. 1775, The telegraph ticker was patented by **R.E. House**. 1846, **Col. Robert E. Lee** turned down an offer to command the Union armies. 1861, The **San Francisco earthquake** hits, killing 700 people. 1906 **Come Softly to Me** by **The Fleetwoods** topped the charts. 1959

19 The Revolutionary War begins as fighting broke out at Lexington. 1775, Connecticut approved the **Bill of Rights** after 148 years. 1939, **Dr. Sally Ride** became the first American woman in space on the shuttle Challenger (STS-7). 1983, **Sonny Bono** was inaugurated as the Mayor of Palm Springs, CA. 1988, Timothy McVeigh bombs the **Federal Building** in

Oklahoma City, killing 168 people, and injuring hundreds more. 1995





the best

We all love love a great steak, and the ribeye (or cowboy steak) is the king cut! These tender steaks taste best crusted with kosher salt and cracked black pepper

STEAK

on the counter...

1-inch thick rib eye steak, 1-2 lbs
2 tsps Kosher salt - 2 tsps freshly cracked black pepper
4 tsps canola oil - 3 tsps butter
2 sprigs thyme - 2 bunches rosemary
2 cloves garlic, crushed

ready . . . Preheat oven to 250° Watch the video

Season the steak evenly with the salt and pepper on all sides. Place the steak on a wire rack on top of a baking sheet. Bake for 35 minutes. Heat the canola oil in a skillet high heat until smoking. Sear the steak on one side for 30 seconds, then flip. Immediately, add the butter, thyme, rosemary, and garlic, swirling the pan to melt the butter quickly. Place the herbs and garlic on top of the steak, and push the steak towards the top of the pan. Tilt the pan towards you to pool the butter near the bottom. Using a spoon, continuously scoop the butter over the top of the steak for about 30-45 seconds. This helps not only flavor the steak, but also helps cook the steak faster. If you prefer your steak medium or medium-well, cook your steak longer. To test the doneness of your steak, lightly press the tip of your left index finger to the tip of your left thumb. The fleshy area below the thumb should feel like what rare steak feels like when pressing the surface of the steak. For medium rare steak, touch your middle finger to your thumb and press the area below your thumb. Rest the steak for 10 minutes on a cutting board. Slice, then serve!




