

Vide Steaks

If you've gone out to a fancy restaurant in the

last five years or so, you've most likely eaten a protein that was cooked sous-vide in a water

bath. The introduction of the <u>Sous-Vide</u> <u>Supreme</u>, the first temperaturecontrolled water bath designed for home cooks promises to do the same for home cookery. You can perfectly cooked proteins without fail juiciness the Colonel's wife only

produce

-chicken with a juiciness the Colonel's wife only dreamed of, and the kind of double-thick pork chops that would've made me break out a celebratory PBR!

They cooked **five prime-grade New York strips at temperatures ranging from** 120°F to 160°F and fed them to a group of a dozen tasters.

120°F (rare): Bright red and slippery on the interior.

130°F (medium-rare): The meat has begun to turn pink, and is significantly firmer.

140°F (medium): Solid rosy pink, and quite firm to the touch.

150°F (medium-well): Pink, but verging on gray.

160°F (well done): Dry, gray, and lifeless.What once was cow, now is dust. So, as far as temperature goes, my strong recommendation is to stick within the 130 to 140°F range.

Well, with a sous-vide cooker, *anyone* can properly cook those tricky chef cuts. \$7 per pound for a hanger steak that is just as tender and tastes much better than a \$16 per pound strip steak? **Yes please!**

ingredients

- 4 steaks, 1/2 lb each kosher salt and freshly ground black pepper
- 12 sprigs thyme (optional) 2 garlic cloves (optional) 2 shallots, thinly sliced (optional) • 2 tablespoons canola oil

procedures

Season steaks generously with salt and pepper. Place in sous-vide bags along with aromatics and distribute evenly. Seal bags and place in water bath set at desired temperature (see note). Allow steaks to cook for at least 45 minutes, and up to 12 hours.

ready to eat, add oil to heavy-bottomed stainless-steel or cast iron skillet large enough to hold steaks comfortably in single layer. Heat over high heat until oil is beginning to smoke. Meanwhile, remove steaks from bag and carefully pat dry on paper towels. Carefully steaks to smoking oil and cook until well browned on all sides, about 2 minutes total. Transfer to paper towels to drain, and serve. When

A banana milkshake with a delicious history




ingredients

1 ½ tablespoons unsalted butter • 1 large banana, sliced • 3 tbsp light brown sugar • ¼ cup dark rum • pinch of ground cinnamon ½ cup cold whole or low fat milk • 8 medium scoops French Vanilla ice cream, softened until just melty at the edges

directions

1. For the bananas Melt the butter in a medium nonstick skillet over medium heat and heat until it stops foaming. Add the bananas and brown sugar, stir to help melt the sugar and coat the bananas,

- and cook, stirring occasionally, until the bananas are soft and saucy, about 2 minutes. 2. Add 3 tablespoons (1½ ounces/45 milliliters) of the rum, allow it to warm for a few
- seconds, and carefully wave a lit chimney match over the pan until the rum ignites. 3. Allow the rum to burn until it extinguishes, about 30 seconds. Off the heat, add the cinnamon, stir to combine, and allow the mixture to cool to room temperature, about 20
- cinnamon, stir to combine, and allow the mixture to cool to room temperature, about 20 minutes. 4 For the shake Place the banapas sauce milk and remaining 1 tablespoon (16 ourse)
- 4. For the shake Place the bananas, sauce, milk, and remaining 1 tablespoon (½ ounce/ 15 milliliters) of rum in a blender and blend to mix thoroughly, about 30 seconds. Add the ice cream and pulse several times to begin breaking it up.
- 5. With the blender motor off, use a flexible spatula to mash the mixture down onto the blender blades. Continue pulsing, stopping, and mashing until the mixture is well blended, thick, and moves easily in the blender jar, roughly 30 to 90 seconds. *Pour into a chilled glass or glasses, and serve at once.*







Those coffee grinds that would normally go into the trash can be saved and then worked into your soil or sprinkled around the plants in your garden. Why should you do this?


