22 The first official **Natl League baseball** game took place. Boston beat Philadelphia 6-5. 1876, The first **Egg Roll** was held on the grounds of the White House. 1878, **James G. IT'S ARBOR DAY

Each year the City plants a tree on Arbor Day, in part to fulfill an obligation for retaining our status as a Tree City USA. This year the event will be a joint ceremony with Municipal Services Commission. The tree will be the first of 8 which MSC will plant in the Dobbinsville Community to compensate for the four mature trees which had to be removed last year when water lines were upgraded.

Also in recognition of Arbor Day, the Delaware Department of Agriculture Forest Services has devoted a tree (White Oak) to the City. Its location is yet to be determined.

The Dobbinsville planting will take place at **8th and Clymer Streets at 10:30 a.m. April 27th.** All are welcome!

SPRING FLUSHING Begins Tomorrow

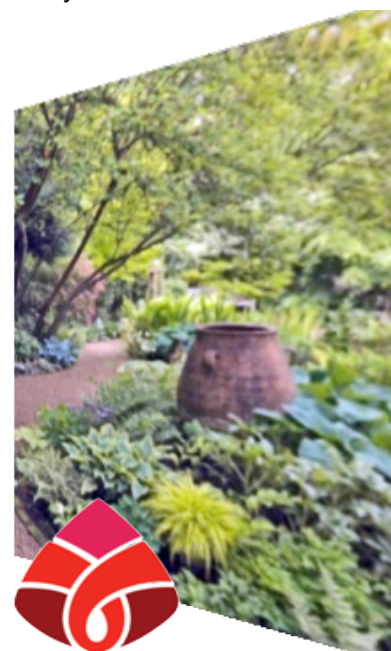

CAPRESE CHICKEN



Tomatoes cooked in balsamic vinegar are the perfect sweet-tart compliment to this cheesy chicken.

GONNA NEED

1 tbsp. extra-virgin olive oil - 1 lb. boneless skinless chicken breasts - kosher salt & freshly ground black pepper - 1/4 c. balsamic vinegar - 2 cloves garlic, minced - 1 pt. grape tomatoes, halved - 2 tbsp. shredded fresh basil - 4 slices mozzarella

LET'S MAKE IT

- In a large skillet (Teditor suggests cast iron) over medium-high heat, heat oil.
- Season chicken with salt and pepper and cook until golden and cooked through, 6 minutes per side. Transfer to a plate.
- Add balsamic vinegar to skillet to deglaze, then add garlic and stir until fragrant, 1 minute. Now's the time to add the tomatoes and season with salt. Let simmer until soft, 5 to 7 minutes.
- Stir in basil.
- Return chicken to skillet and nestle in tomatoes. Top with mozzarella and cover with a lid to melt cheese.
- Spoon tomatoes over chicken and serve.

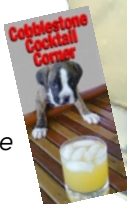

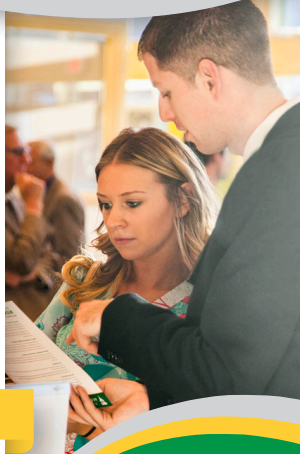

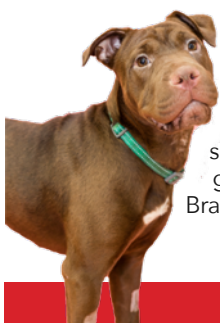
