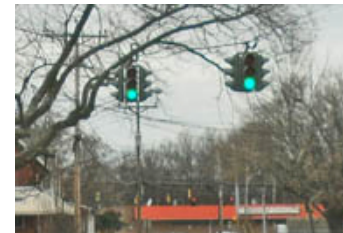

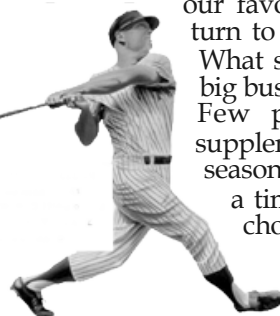

BASEBALL DOLLAR\$



It's a new baseball season and while we cheer on our favorite team and player, many discussions turn to the price they're paid to play "a game". What started, as a game for the 'sport' today is big business.

Few players today have to worry about supplementing their incomes during the off-season. That wasn't always the case. There was a time professional baseball players had little choice but to augment their on-field hustle with some serious winter side hustling.

In the '66 World Series, 20-year-old Oriole pitcher Jim Palmer bested another future Hall of Famer, Sandy Koufax, 6-0, becoming the youngest player ever to pitch a complete game and a World Series shutout, helping his team secure their first-ever championship title. A week after making history, the baseball phenom, whose wife was expecting their first child, reported for duty at his other job: as sales associate at a men's clothing store. Palmer's Jockey-clad body would one day grace billboards and television, bringing the 268-game winner a side income as comfortable as his fabled underwear, but winning the World Series was not enough for a young player to make ends meet without selling a few suits on the side. "I made \$150 a week," he once told The New York Times. "Enough to pay for groceries, hot water and electricity."

New York Giants manager John McGraw, known as "Little Napoleon" for his fiery temper, earned \$3,000 a week playing himself on the vaudeville circuit in 1912. Even the man who would become baseball's biggest star, Babe Ruth, had several side jobs. In addition to barnstorming tours, the he took to the silver screen, featuring in the 1920 silent flick Heading Home about his own life.

You probably never heard of Richie Hebner, a longtime Pirates infielder, who hit 203 home runs over 18 big-league seasons but dug countless more graves at his family-owned cemetery in Massachusetts over a 35-year grave-digging career. You just won't see many players today picking up a pick and shovel as part of their off-season conditioning.

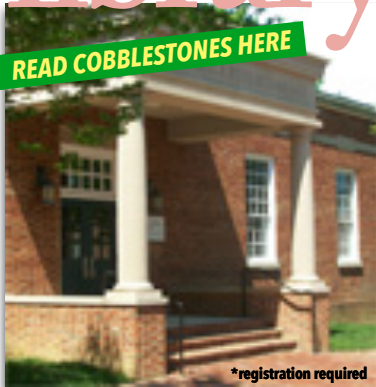

Simple Slaw

Clean and simple 8 ingredients

— apple cider, cider vinegar, cabbage, mustard seeds, celery seeds, sugar, salt and pepper to taste — combine into what ought to be a staple of your repertoire. You'll need to cook the cider down by half before using it, but everything else goes in raw, and the combination matures over the course of a few hours into a side dish that can accompany just about anything grilled or roasted, pulled or hacked.

Ya gonna need

2 cups apple cider • ½ cup cider vinegar • 6 cups shredded cabbage • 1 tbsp mustard seeds • 1 tbsp celery seeds • 2 tbsp sugar • salt and pepper, to taste

Now ya fix

- 1 In a small pan, bring cider to a boil over high heat. Turn heat down slightly and continue to boil until reduced by about half, about 20 minutes. Allow to cool to warm room temperature, then stir in vinegar.
- 2 Put cabbage, mustard seeds, celery seeds, sugar and salt and pepper in a large bowl. Pour in cider mixture, and toss well to coat.

InsideOut Bloody Mary

Inside Out!? As it turns out, it is basically a spicy martini poured over bloody mary CUBES! The cubes melt into the drink as you drink the liquid, thereby preventing watered down drinks. **What a fantastic idea,**

You can use Mr. and Mrs. T's Bold and Spicy Bloody Mary Mix but if you don't want to use a mix, mix up some tomato juice or V8, prepared horseradish, black pepper, celery salt, worcestershire sauce, etc. Whatever floats your boat.

So freeze the cubes. Once they're done, run a lime slice around the rim of the glass and rim with a cajun seasoning.

A few bloody Mary cubes (2-3) – 3 oz your favorite vodka – Splash of lemon – Splash of lime – Dash of hot sauce

Add your favorite vodka, splash lime, splash lemon and dash of hot sauce into a shaker filled with ice cubes (made of water). Shake what yo' mama gave you until the shaker has a fine layer of ice coating it and strain over the Bloody Mary cubes.

They anticipate lane and parking restrictions throughout the project but have attempted to be sensitive to the Communities concerns.

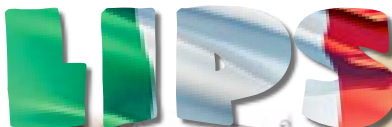

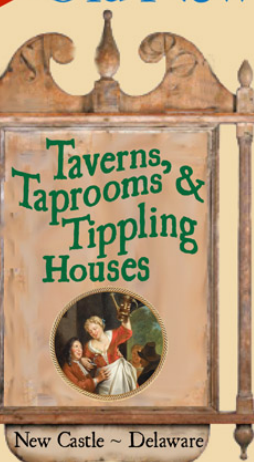

Public comments during the past year could fill volumes and THE WEEKLY has printed countless letters on the subject...mostly from irritated residents and some who welcome the interaction with the visitors. NC Police Chief Rogers has repeatedly asked the public to **call 911** and they will respond. They can't be everywhere at one time. That opens the door to another topic – **DEannexing**.
