New at the Read House

A must see this Day in Old New Castle is the new, historically correct, carpet recently installed.

After fifteen years, and hundreds of thousands of footsteps by visitors, students, and staff, the main staircase at the Read House & Gardens has been adorned with a brand new carpet. Staff members from the Delaware Historical Society's Education and Inspiration Group recently took a field trip to ► [Family Heirloom Weavers](#) in Red Lion, PA to see the new runner in the making.

The care given to assure textiles are woven in historically accurate styles and processes is important for display at the Read House & Gardens, where documentation of the furnishings of the primary rooms is quite rich. The 1836 estate inventory indicates that bare floors were covered with carpeting, including Scotch carpeting in the front parlor, and rag carpets in the front hall, Mrs. Read's bedchamber, and the kitchen. Carpet also commonly covered stairs and stair landings in the nineteenth century. It is not explicitly listed in the inventory and no other documentation has yet been found which details what type of carpet covered the stairs at the Read House.

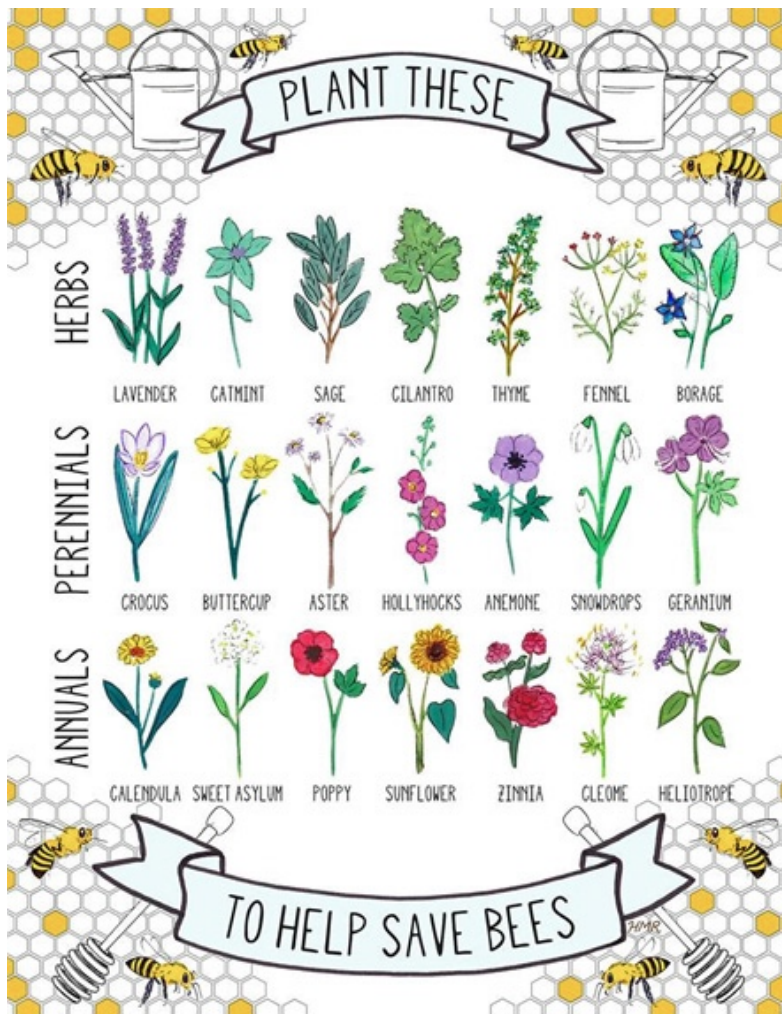

Shrimp Scampi

over linguine



on the counter

Vegetable oil
1 tbsp kosher salt plus 1½ tsps
¾ pound linguine
3 tbsps unsalted butter
2½ tbsps good olive oil
1½ tbsps minced garlic (4 cloves)
1 lb large shrimp (about 16 shrimp),
peeled and deveined
¼ tsp freshly ground black pepper
½ cup chopped fresh parsley leaves
½ lemon, zest grated
¼ cup freshly squeezed lemon juice
¼ lemon, thinly sliced in half-rounds
½ tsp hot red pepper flakes



how to

Drizzle some oil in a large pot of boiling salted water, add 1 tbsp of salt and the linguine, and cook for 7 to 10 minutes, or according to the directions on the package.

Meanwhile, in another large (12-inch), heavy-bottomed pan, melt the butter and olive oil over medium-low heat. Add the garlic. Sauté for 1 minute. Be careful, the garlic burns easily! Add the shrimp, 1½ tsps of salt, and the pepper and sauté until the shrimp have just turned pink, about 5 minutes, stirring often. Remove from the heat, add the parsley, lemon zest, lemon juice, lemon slices, and red pepper flakes. Toss to combine.

Drain the cooked linguine and then put it back in the pot. Immediately add the shrimp and sauce, toss well, and serve.

Time to prep for Derby Day

Before enjoying the cocktail in a silver cup over a mountain of crushed ice, it's reinvented here as a gelatin shot.

Pour the water into a medium saucepan and sprinkle the gelatin over. Let stand five minutes, then add the sugar and heat over medium heat, stirring until the sugar dissolves. Remove from the heat, add the mint leaves, cover and let stand 10 minutes. Pour through a fine-mesh strainer into a large measuring cup and stir in the bourbon.

Using 10 cups put one mint leaf and one raspberry in each cup. Fill each cup with the liquid, then transfer to the refrigerator and refrigerate until set, for about 4 hours.

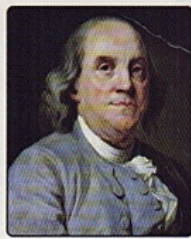

DAYTIME MOON

Every full moon rises around sunset and sets around sunrise. But now the moon is in a waning gibbous phase - rising later each night - and setting in the west later each day after sunrise. So, in the several mornings following full moon - after sunrise - look for the waning gibbous moon in the west during the morning hours. At mid-northern latitudes in North America, the moon will set some 1.5 hours (or more) **after sunrise on April 24, 2016** and will set roughly 45 minutes later after sunrise each day thereafter.
